

[Whitehall, March 20, 1809.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that, on Sunday the 11th December last, about Eight of the Clock in the Evening, Mr. William White, of Hso, near the City of Rochester, Farmer, was barbarously murdered as he was sitting by his Fire-Side, by some Person or Persons unknown, who discharged a Gun through a Window, which instantly deprived him of Life;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in such atrocious Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually fired the said Gun) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered by Mr. Thomas Denton, of Strood, in Kent, and ONE HUNDRED POUNDS by Thomas Hulkes, Esq; of Rochester, to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as is before excepted,) to be paid on the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
