Commissary-General's-Office, Great George-Street, London, April 12, 1809.

Notice is hereby given, that the Commissary-General is ready to receive Proposals for supplying such of His Majesty's Troops as may be encamped in the course of the present Year in the following Districts, with Bread, Fuel, Forage, and Straw; such Proposals to be sent in on or before the 3d Day of May, (observing that none will be received after Eleven o'Clock on that Day,) and if sent by Post, the Postage must be paid, viz.
