AT the Council-Chamber *Whitehall*, the 18th of April 1809,

P R E S E N T,

The Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making further Provision for the effectual Performance of Quarantine," it is among other Things enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council, or any Three or more of them, to make such Order as they shall see necessary and expedient upon any unforeseen Emergency, or in any particular Case or Cases with respect to any Ship or Ships, Vessel or Vessels arriving and having any infectious Disease or Distemper on board, or on board of which any infectious Disease or Distemper may have appeared in the Course of the Voyage, or arriving under any other alarming or suspicious Circumstances as to Infection, although such Ship or Ships, Vessel or Vessels shall not have come from any Place or Places from which His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, may have adjudged and declared it probable that the Plague, or any such infectious Disease or Distemper may be brought, and also with respect to the Persons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandise on board the same; and all such Orders so made by the Lords or others of the Privy Council, or any Three or more of them as aforesaid, shall be as good, valid, and effectual to all Intents and Purposes (as well with respect to the Commander, Master, or other Person having the Charge of any such Ship or Vessel, and all other Persons on board the same, as with respect to any other Persons having any Intercourse or Communication with them, and to the Penalties, Forfeitures, and Punishments, to which they may respectively become liable) as

any Order or Orders made by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection as aforesaid, and notified by Proclamation or published in the London Gazette:

And whereas Advice has been received, that a dangerous Fever of a very contagious Description has prevailed in the Ports of Stockholm and Carlscrona, and particularly the latter, and has raged with the most fatal Violence during even the Severity of the Winter; and as there must have been some Danger of the same having spread throughout the Kingdom of Sweden, it is hereby ordered in Council, That all Ships and Vessels coming from or having touched at the Ports of Stockholm or Carlscrona, or any other Port in Sweden, or having received any Person or Persons, Goods, Wares or Merchandise, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any other Articles whatsoever, from out of any such Ship or Vessel, shall, on their Arrival on the Coasts of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark and other Isles, come to Anchor at such Place and Places as shall be or shall be appointed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, within or without the Port to which such Ships or Vessels shall be bound, in order that the State of Health of the Crew and Persons on board may be duly examined into and ascertained, prior to such Ships and Vessels being permitted to enter the Port of their Destination; and that in the mean Time, no Intercourse with any other Ship or Vessel, or Boat, or with the Shore, shall be permitted, nor any of the Crew or Persons on board such Ships or Vessels be suffered to come or be brought on Shore:

And it is hereby further Ordered, That in case upon such Examination it shall appear to the Superintendent or other Principal Officer of the Customs employed in the Quarantine Service, that such Ships or Vessels have the same contagious Fever actually

on board, or that any of the Crew or Persons on board have been ill or have died of such contagious Fever within the Space of Forty Days prior to the Arrival of such Ships or Vessels on the Coasts of this Kingdom, or of the Islands aforesaid, or that in the Event of any Death occasioned by such contagious Fever having taken Place on board at an earlier Period of the Voyage than Forty Days prior to their Arrival on the Coasts of this Kingdom, or of the Islands aforesaid, the Clothes and Bedding, and all Personal Effects susceptible of Infection worn by or belonging to the Persons so deceased were not thrown overboard and sunk immediately upon such Decease, or as soon after as possible; or in case it shall appear that such Ships had within the Space of Forty Days, prior to Arrival on the Coasts of this Kingdom, or of the Islands aforesaid, received any Person or Persons, or any of the Articles hereinbefore mentioned, from out of any Ship, Vessel or Boat coming from the Ports of Stockholm and Carlscrona, or any other Port in Sweden, then and in such Case every such Ship and Vessel, with their Cargoes and Persons on board, shall perform a Quarantine of Fifteen Days (or of such further Time as may be afterwards directed by any Order or Orders of Three or more of the Lords or others of His Majesty's Privy Council) at the several Places appointed for the Performance of Quarantine by Ships subject and liable thereto, and bound to the said several Ports respectively:

And it is hereby further ordered, That notwithstanding the Ships and Vessels arriving or to arrive from any of the Ports of Sweden, may not be found liable to the Performance of Quarantine as above directed, no Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, enumerated in the First Class of His Majesty's said Order in Council, bearing Date the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, concerning Quarantine, which may be imported in any of the said Ships from any of the Ports of Sweden, nor any Packages of Goods, which Packages may consist wholly or in Part of any of the said Articles so enumerated, be suffered to be landed or brought on Shore, but shall be taken out of the Ships and Vessels importing the same, and sent to the usual Place appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, and be there opened and aired for the Space of Fifteen Days, as directed by His Majesty's said Order in Council of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, Sec. 13. with respect to Goods, Wares and Merchandizes coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General, and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secre-

tary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the said Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *Steph. Cottrell.*

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir John Borlase Warren, Bart. and K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Halifax, to the Honourable William Wellesley Pole, dated at Bermuda, the 22d February 1809.

SIR,

I HAVE the Satisfaction to inclose to you, for their Lordships' Information, the Copy of a Letter from Captain Scott, of His Majesty's Ship *Horatio*, who returned here this Day with the French Frigate *La Junon*, of Forty-four Guns, Eighteen-Pounders, and Three Hundred and Twenty-three Men; captured after a very gallant Action, in which the good Conduct and Skill of Captain Scott, his Officers, and Men, appeared with much Distinction.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that, in performing your Orders, in the Morning of the 10th Instant, in Lat. 19° 50' N. Long. 63° 30' W. standing on the Larboard Tack, Ship's Head South and by East, the Driver Sloop of War under my Orders about Fifteen or Sixteen Miles nearly astern, at Half-past Ten A. M. saw a Sail on our Lee Bow, and shortly afterwards another. In the Course of an Hour, we discovered the Lee one evidently to be an Enemy's Frigate, and the other one I took to be an English Brig of War dodging her.

The Enemy's Frigate on making us out bore right up before the Wind for a short Time, but very soon hauled up again. At Three Quarters past Twelve, we met upon different Tacks and came to close Action, the *Horatio* wearing under the Enemy's Stern to get upon the same Tack with her. In the early Part of the Action the Country lost the Services of the First Lieutenant Manley Hall Dixon, being badly wounded, and not long after, I am sorry to say, that I received a severe Wound in the Shoulder by a Grape Shot, which obliged me to submit to quit the Deck: however, the Service did not suffer by that Event, as the succeeding Lieutenant the Honourable George Douglas fought the Ship through the Action in a most gallant Manner, which continued about One Hour and Thirty-five Minutes. The Enemy having from the Beginning pointed their Guns high, we were by this Time a complete Wreck in our Masts, Sails, and Rigging. Notwithstanding the Situation the Enemy was then reduced to, she tried to effect her Escape, which I knew was impossible, from the State of her Rigging, and more particularly as at that Time the Superieur (the Brig I before mentioned) hailed us, and gave us Information that the strange Sail just seen to Leeward was the *Latona*. On the *Latona's* coming within Gun Shot of the Enemy and giving her a few Guns, which she returned, and slightly wounded a few of the *Latona's* Men, she immediately brought

to on the Starboard Tack, and every Mast went by the board. She proved to be the French Frigate La Junon, of Forty-four Guns, and Three Hundred and Twenty-three Men, commanded by Mont. Augustin Roussleau, a Member of the Legion of Honour; out from the Saints only Four Days, bound to France.

I now detail the Losses and Damages sustained by His Majesty's Ship under my Command.

The Horatio has suffered but little in her Hull, from the Reason already given, of the Enemy's aiming particularly at our Masts and Rigging, which they effected, having nothing else standing but our lower Masts, much wounded, and completely dismantled, ail to our Foresail, and the Rags of our Mainfail.

The Number of Officers, Seamen, and Marines lost on this Occasion to their Country and their Friends, are by no Means considerable, when compared with the dreadful Losses of the Enemy, which I shall hereafter relate. The Losses on board the Horatio consists of Mr. George Gunter, Midshipman, and Six Seamen, killed; Mr. Andrew Lock, Boatswain, and Twelve Seamen, badly wounded; Lieutenant Richard Blakeney, of the Royal Marines, Mr. Robert King, Master's Mate, Six Seamen, and Two Marines, slightly wounded. The Losses of the Enemy, as I have before stated, was all her lower Masts; her Hull most wonderfully cut up, making, in consequence, a great Deal of Water, until the Shot-Holes were stopped.

The Losses in killed and wounded amounted to One hundred and thirty. The Captain expired soon after the Action from the Wounds he received.

The Gallantry and good Conduct of the Officers and Ship's Company under my Command, I must always remember with Gratitude, and were I to enter into Particulars it would be endless.

To Captain Ferrie, who commands the Brig Supérieur (one of Sir Alexander Cochrane's Squadron), I feel much indebted for the very gallant Manner he behaved, although I believe he had only Four small Carronades on board; and to Captain Pigot of the Latona I shall ever feel thankful for his Exertions and Activity in erecting Jury Masts, &c. and putting the Prize in a Sea worthy State.

I have much Pleasure in informing you that the Junon appears a very fine Ship, only Three Years old, never having been at Sea before she left France, about Three Months ago.
