HEREAS a Treaty of Amity has been con-cluded between His Majelly and the Sublime Porte, it is this Day ordered by His Majesty, hy and with the Advice of His Privy Council. That the Order made by His Majetty in Council, bearing Date the Thirteenth of May One thousand cight hundred and seven, by which it is directed, "That no Ships or Vessels belonging to any of His Majelty's Subjects he permitted to enter and clear out for any of the Ports within the Dominions of the Grand Signior until further Order, and that a general Embargo or Stop be made of all Ships or Vessels whatever belonging to the Subjects of the Grand Signior within any of His Mijesty's Dominions, together with all Persons and Effects on board all such Ships and Vessels; and that the Com-manders of His Majesty's Ships of War and Pri-vateers do detain and bring into Port all Ships and Vessels belonging to the Subjects of the Grand Signior, or bearing the Flag of the Ottoman Empire," be henceforth revoked and dicharged: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majelly's Tréasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain
