and Brigadier Géneral Campbell attacked their Poli- | tion; and having turned their Left Flank by the Heights, they abandoned it, leaving: a Gun and fome Frifovers behind them. This Attack-was neceffarily made at a late Hour in the Evening.

On the Seventeenth, we moved to Ruivaes (waiting to fee whether the Enemy would turn upon Chaves, or continue his Retreat upon Monte Alegre) and on the Eighteenth to this Place.

I here found that he had taken a Road through the Mountains towards Orenfe, by which it would be difficult, if not impossible, for me to overtake him, and on which I had no Means of flopping him.

The Enemy commenced this Retreat, as I have informed your Lordship, by deftroying a great Pro-portion of his Guns and Ammunition. He afterwards deltroyed the Remainder of both, and a great Proportion of his Baggage, and kept nothing excepting what the Soldiers or a few Mules could carry. He has left behind him his Sick and Wounded and the Road from Penafiel to Monte Alegre is strewed with the Carcales of Horles and Mules, and French Soldiers, who were put to Death by the Peafantry before our Advanced Guard could fave them.

This last Circumstance is the natural Effect of the Species of Warfare which the Enemy have carried on in this Country.

Their Soldiers have plundered and murdered the Peafantry at their Pleasure; and I have seen many Perfons hanging in the Trees by the Sides of the Road, executed for no Reafon that I could learn, excepting that they have not been friendly to the French Invalion and Uturpation of the Government of their Country; and the Route of their Column on their Retreat could be traced by the Smoke of the Villages to which they fet Fire. We have taken about Five Hundred Priloners.

Upon the whole the Enemy has not loft lefs than a Fourth of his Army, and all his Artillery and Equipments, fince we attacked him upon the Vonga.

I hope your Lordship will believe that no Measure which I could take was omitted to intercept the Enemy's Retreat. It is obvious, however, that if an Army throws away all its Cannon, Equipments, and Baggage, and every Thing which can ftrengthen it, and can enable it to act together as a Body, and abandous all those who are entitled to its Protection, but add to its Weight and impede its Progress, it must be able to march by Roads through which it cannot be followed with any Prospect of being overtaken by an Army which has not made the fame Sacrifices.

It is impossible to fay too much of the Exertions of the Troops. The Weather has been very bad indeed. Since the Thirteenth, the Rain has been constant, and the Roads in this difficult Country almost Impracticable. But they have perfevered in the Purfuit to the last, and have been generally on their March from Day-light in the Morning till

Dark. The Brigade of Guards were at the Head of the Column, and fet a laudable Example; and in the Affair with the Enemy's Rear Guard on the Evening of the 16th, they conducted themfelves remarkzbly well.
