HEREAS, from Information received, there is reason to believe that the contagious Fever which prevailed last Winter at Stockholm and Carlferona no longer exists; it is therefore ordered, that the Order in Council of the Twenty-ninth of April last, by which it was directed, that Ships and Vessels arriving from the said Ports of Stockholm and Carlicrona should still be subject to the Performance of Quarantine, be, and the same is hereby revoked; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Matter-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majelty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Com manders in Chief, for the Time being, of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
