Neapolitan Privateer Le Lucien Charles, commanded by Chevalier Charles Lucien Prevoft de Boiffi, Adjutant-General de France, Officer de la Legion d' Honneur. Le Lucien Charles is a new Boinbarde of about Sixty Tons; fhe mounts One Twelve and Two Six-Pounders, and is well found in fmall Arms, with a Complement of Fifty-three Men; fhe is Ten Days from Naples, and has not made any Capture. Being much furprifed to find an Officer of General de Boiffi's Rank in the Command of a small Privateer, I caufed the most diligent Search to be made for Papers; but none were discovered except those that relate to the Bombarde; it is fortunate the Pomone fell in with this Privateer, as Two very valuable Smyrna Ships were in Sight, at the Time of her Capture. Extract of a Letter from Captain Campbell of His Ma-jefty's Ship the Naffau, to the Honourable William Wellefley Pole, dated off the Start Point, the 6th In-Rant.

BE pleafed to inform my Lords Commiffiouers of the Admiralty, that at Daylight this Morning, standing up Channel with the East India Convoy, observed a sufpicious Lugger standing to the Southward, diftant about Five Miles, made all Sail in Chace, but the Breeze dying away, I fent Four Boats under the Command of Lieutenants Gregory, Pyne, Drake, and Jackfon, who volunteered ; and, after a Chace of Two Hours, came up with and carried her. I am well fatisfied, had fhe been of much greater Force they would have boarded her.

She proved to be the Jean Bart, French Lugger Privateer, of Four Guns and Twenty-five Men, belonging to Saint Maloes, commanded by Louis Olli-vier Pilveffe, Enfeign de Vaisseau, Five Days out from the Isle de Bas, and had made no Captures.
