A PROCLAMATION,

GEORGE R.

HEREAS Our Parliament flands prorogued to Tuesday the Fifth Day of December next: We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the faid Parliament Thall be further prorogued on the faid Fifth Day of December next, to Tuelday the Twenty-third Day of January next: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do further hereby, with the Advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the faid Parliament shall, on the said Twenty-third Day of January mext, be held and fit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes, and the Commissioners of Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster, on the said Twenty-third Day of January next.

of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwile, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of December nexts And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of December next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or faip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forseitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, palled in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An " Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the " Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower " His Majelty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of " Salt-Petre, Gungowder, or any Sort of Arms or " Ammunition:"-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpec-Step b.
