## PROCLAMATION

#### For purdoning Deferters from His Majefly's Land Forces.

War-Office, Officer 24, 1809. HEREAS it has bren moft humbly fubmitted to the King, whether, on the joyful Occasion of His Majelly's entering into the Fiftieth Year of His Reign, it might no be defirable to diffinguish fo memorable an Époch by an Act of Grace to all Deferters; and His Majelky having gracioully approved of His Free Pardon being extended to all fuch Deferters from His Land Forces as shall deliver themselves up within Two Months from the 25th Instant : Thefe ore publicly to declare His Majefly's benewolent Intention ; and to direct that all Deferters, furrendering themfelves to the Commanding Offi-

cer of any Regiment, or to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, while Stations are mentioned in the Margin bereof; to the Commandant Durham. of the Army Depot in the Ifle of Wight; or, where there is no Milliary Poff, to a Magiftrate, Shall be particulate, and they Carlifle. Lees. are bereby pardoned accordingly. Manchefter.

Nottingham. Ipfruick. Shrewfbury. Birmingham. Hereford. Bedford. Mailftone. Gioucefter. Wells.

Such Delerters, if from the, Regu-lar Forces, being Able-bodied Men and it for Service, shall be fent to the Regiments from which they refpectively deferted, or be appointed to fuch Regiments in the United King-dom as His Majefty may be pleafed to command; and, when to placed, thall Southumpton. not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged: and if from the Mi-

London. litia, shall be fent to the Regiments to which they refpectively belonged.

And Whereas many of the faid Deferters may have enlifted in other Corps, and are now ferving therein, His Majefty is graciously pleased to extend to such Deferters the Benefit of this Pardon ; and to direct that they shall continue to ferve in the Corps wherein they now are, upon declaring themfelves to their respective Commanding Officers, on or before the Period abovementioned : and they shall not be liable, at any future Time, to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly ferved.

The Magistrate, to whom any Deferter, as above, may furrender himfelf, is authorized and required to certify the Day on which fuch Deferter furrendered himfelf; which Certificate is to continue in Force until the Arrival of the Deferter at the nearest Military Post, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unless prevented by Sickness, to be certified by fome Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magistrate's Certificate; or to be otherwife proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer commanding at fuch Military Polt.

His Majesty has further been pleased to direct, that Deferters now actually in Confinement as fuch, shall have the Benefit of this His Royal Pardon.
