Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that Three Persons did, on Friday Evening the 1st Instant, between the Hours of Ten and Eleven o'Clock, on the New Road leading from the City of Rochester to the Sign of the Gibraltar, in the Parish of Chatham, dreadfully wound, with Intent to murder, Mr. Thomas Boucher, sen. of the said City,

by cutting his Throat in a most shocking Manner, and, after rifling his Pockets, threw him into a Field, and there left him for dead, in consequence of which Wound his Life is much despaired of;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the Persons concerned in such atrocious Act, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually cut and wounded the said Mr. Boucher) who shall discover his or their Accomplices or Accomplices therein, of that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
