 Pursuant to an Act of Parliament, passed in the Twenty-sixth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, this is to give Notice to those whom it may concern, That Information has been received at this Office, that the Vessel Rambler, of Dundee, was found by the Violet Privateer, ——— Deer, Master, in Latitude 49° 29', Longitude 8° 30' West, and brought into Fowey Harbour on the 12th Instant; that she is laden with Oranges, (as far as can be discovered,) and is supposed to have come from Lisbon or Seville; her Main Deck was cut open near the Hatchways; neither small Boat, Books, Charts, nor Sea Instruments, Bedding, Apparel, nor Men, were found on board her; and it is presumed that she had been captured by the Enemy, and afterwards abandoned.
