The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been humbly repreferted to His Majefty, that the Islands of Feroe and Iceland, and also certain Settlements on the Coaß of Greenland, Parts of the Dominions of Denmark, have, tince the Commencement of the War between Great Britain and Denmark, been deprived of all Intercourie with Denmark, and that the Inhabitants of those 1flands and Settlements are, in confequence of the Want of their accustomed Supplies, reduced to extreme Milery, being without many of the Ne-ceffaries and of most of the Conveniencies of Life:

His Majetty, being moved by Compation for the Sufferings of these defenceless People, has, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, thought fit to declare His Royal Will and Pleafure, and it is hereby declared and ordered, that the faid Islands of Feroe and Iceland and the Settlements on the Coaft of Greenland, and the Inhabitants thereof, and the Property therein, shall be exempted from the At-tack and Hostility of His Majesty's Forces and Sub-.jects, and that the Ships belonging to Inhabitants of fuch Iflands and Settlements, and all Goods, being of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the faid Islands and Sectlements, on board the Ships belonging to fuch Inhabitants, engaged in a direct Trade between fuch Islands and Settlements respectively, and the Ports of London or Leith, shall not be liable to Seizure and Confilcation as Prize :

His Majefty is further pleafed to order, with the Advice aforefaid, that the People of all the faid Islands and Settlments be confidered, when refident in His Majelty's Dominions, as Stranger Friends, under the Safeguard of His Majefty's Royal Peace, and entitled to the Protection of the Laws of the Realm, and in no Cafe treated as Alien Enemies:

His Majelty is further pleafed to order, with the Advice alorethid, that the Ships of the United Kingdom, navigated according to Law, be permitted to repair to the faid Iflands and Settlements, and to trade with the Inhabitants thereof :

And His Majetty is further pleafed to order, with the Advice aforefaid, that all His Majeffy's Cruizers |

T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 7th of and all other his Subjects be inhibited from committing any Acts of Depredation or Violence against the Perfons, Ships, and Goods of any of the Inhabi-tants of the faid Islands and Settlements, and against any Property in the faid Islands and Settlements respectively.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury, His Majefty's. Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an A& made and paffed in the Forty-fixth Year of His Majelty's Reign, in-tituled "An A& for authorizing His Majelty in Council to allow, during the prefent War, and for Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, the Importation and Exportation of certain Goods and Commodities in Neutral Ships, into and from His Majeffy's Territories in the Weft Indies and Continent of South America;" it is enacled, that from and after the passing of the faid Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majeffy, His Heirs and Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His and their Privy Council, to permit or to authorize the Governors of the faid Iflands and Territories, in fuch Manner and under fuch Reftrictions as to His Majelly, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council shall seen sit, to permit, when the Neceffity of the Cafe shall appear to His Majelty, with the Advice of His Privy Council to require it, from Fime to Time, during the prefent War, and for Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, the Importation into, and Exportation from any Island in the Welt Indies, (in which Defcription the Bahama Iflands and the Bermada or Somer Idands are included,) or any Lands or Territories on the Continent of South America, to His

Majelty belonging, of any fuch Articles, Goods and Commodities as shall be mentioned in fuch Order of His Majefty in Council, in any Ships or Veffels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majefty, in fuch Manner as His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, by and with the Advice aforefaid, shall direct, whereupon certain Orders of Council were made on the Twelfth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and nine, the Sixteenth Day of Augult One thousand eight hundred and nine, and the Tenth Day of January One thousand eight hundred and ten, which Orders were made to continue in force for a limited Time : And whereas it appears at prefent to be necessary, to permit for a further limited Time, fubject to be fooner terminated, varied or altered, as is herein after provided, the Importation into and Exportation from the Islands and Territories of His Majesty in the West Indies, (including the Bahama Iflands and the Bermuda or Somer Islands,) and the Lands and Territories on the Continent of South America, to His Majefty belonging, of certain Articles, Goods and Commodities herein-after mentioned, in Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majelty; His Majelty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered, that the faid Three Orders of Council made on the Twelfth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and nine, the Sixteenth Day of August One thousand eight hundred and nine, and the Tenth Day of January One thouland eight hundred and ten, shall continue and be in force until the First Day of December One thousand eight hundred and ten, and that from and after the First Day of December One thousand eight hundred and ten, it shall be lawful for the Governor or Lieutenant Governor of any of His Majelty's Islands in the Welt Indies, (in which Description the Bahama Islands and the Bermuda or Somer Islands are included,) and of any Lands or Territories on the Continent of South America, to His Majelty belonging, to permit until the First Day of December One thousand eight hundred and eleven, fubject to be fooner terminated, waried or altered, as herein-after provided, in Ships or Veffels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majefty, the Importation into the faid Islands, Lands and Territories respectively, of Staves and Lumber, Horses, Mules, Astes, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, and every other Species of Live Stock, and Live Provisions, and also of every Kind of Provisions whatloever, (Beef, Pork and Butter excepted,) and also the Exportation from the faid Iflands, Lands and Territories respectively, into which Importation as aforefaid shall be made of Rum and Molaffes, and of any other Goods and Commodities whatloever, except Sugar, Indigo, Cotton Wool, Coffee and Cocoa; provided always, that fuch Articles fo to be imported, except Staves and Lumber, shall be of the Growth or Produce of the Country to which the Ship or Vefiel importing the fame shall belong, and that Staves and Lumber shall be imported from the Country to which the Ship or Vessel importing the fame shall belong ; provided alfo, that fuch Ships or Veffels fhould duly enter into, report, and deliver their respective Cargoes, and reload at fuch Ports only where regular Cuitom-Houfes shall have been eftablished.

But it is His Majefty's Pleafure neverthelefs; and His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy

Council, is further pleafed to order, and has hereby ordered, that nothing herein-before contained, fhall be confirued to permit, after the faid First Day of December One thousand eight hundred and ten, the Importation of Staves, Lumber, Horse, Mules, Affes, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, Live Stock, Live Provisions, or any Kind of Provisiono whatloever as aforefaid, into any of the faid Islands, Lands or Territories in which there shall not be, at the Time when such Articles shall be brought for Importation, the following Duties on such Articles being of the Growth or Produce of the United States of America, namely:

As several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone.into Foreign Countries to exercise their feveral Callings, contrary to the Laws of the Kingdoms, the follow ing Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His prefent Majefty, for preventing fuch Practices, are publified, for she Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them : And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or infirumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Infruments used by them, as well as to the Artifi-cers or Manufacturers themfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27. F any Perfon thall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Aflizes or Quarter Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and

imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid. If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister, or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfons (hall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devife, or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Inflice of Peace, that any Peifon is endeavour-ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majelty's Dominions, for the Purpoles afore-faid, fuch Jutlice may fend his Werrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty



him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforclaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reafonable, and thall be imprifoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed In Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assiss or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Juffieiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the Kiug's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Fortesture be paid: And in case of a subsequent Offence of fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending the shall forfeit, for every Perlon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and thall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to iome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly uled in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Of-tence, forfeit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Sef-tion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majefty's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall find on board any Veffel not bound directly to some Port

of any of the faid Offences, such Justice may bind | in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain's and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be pub-licly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize. and fecure the fame.
