HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, for the A Information of my Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, that this Afternoon at Five o'Clock, Beachy Head bearing E.N.E. Five or Six Leagues, His Majefty's Sloop under my Command captured, after a fhort Chace, Le Modefte French Lugger Privateer, pierced for Eighteen Guns, but had only Four mounted, having a Complement of Forty-three Men, and commanded by Monfieur Prosper Paul Feray, out Sixteen Hours from Fecamp and had not taken any Thing. Two other Luggers were iu Company with her, which made off with all Sail fet, and having Charge of a Convoy prevented my giving Chace to them.
