LORD CHANCELLOR.—Friday the 9th Day of March, in the Fiftieth Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, 1810, between the Honourable George Herbert and Frances his Wife, Plaintiffs; James Roper Head, and others, Defendants.

FORasmuch as this Court was this Day informed by Mr. Heys, of Counsel for the Plaintiffs, that the Plaintiffs on the 13th Day of October 1809, filed their amended Bill in this Court against the Defendants, as by the Six Clerks' Certificate appears, and took out Process of Subpœna returnable on the 6th Day of November 1809, requiring the Defendant James Roper Head, to appear to and answer the same; that it appears by the Affidavit of Frances Charlotte Patrick, Widow, that the Defendant James Roper Head left this Country in the latter End of 1808, or the Beginning of 1809, and shortly afterwards arrived at Lisbon, and she believes the said James Roper Head, if living, is now resident in Lisbon, or in some Place contiguous thereto; that it appears by the Affidavit of David Baxter Lewis, that in December 1808, the Defendant James Roper Head quitted his Residence and embarked on board His Majesty's Ship Conqueror, then bound for Lisbon, and arrived there in January
