AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 7th of February 1810,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to His Majesty, that the Islands of Feroe and Iceland, and also certain Settlements on the Coast of Greenland, Parts of the Dominions of Denmark, have, since the Commencement of the War between Great Britain and Denmark, been deprived of all Intercourse with Denmark, and that the Inhabitants of those Islands and Settlements are, in consequence of the Want of their accustomed Supplies, reduced to extreme Misery, being without many of the Necessaries and of most of the Conveniencies of Life :

His Majesty, being moved by Compassion for the Sufferings of these defenceless People, has, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, thought fit to declare His Royal Will and Pleasure, and it is hereby declared and ordered, that the said Islands of Feroe and Iceland and the Settlements on the Coast of Greenland, and the Inhabitants thereof, and the Property therein, shall be exempted from the Attack and Hostility of His Majesty's Forces and Subjects, and that the Ships belonging to Inhabitants of such Islands and Settlements, and all Goods, being of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the said Islands and Settlements, on board the Ships belonging to such Inhabitants, engaged in a direct Trade between such Islands and Settlements respectively, and the Ports of London or Leith, shall not be liable to Seizure and Confiscation as Prize :

His Majesty is further pleased to order, with the Advice aforesaid, that the People of all the said Islands and Settlements be considered, when resident in His Majesty's Dominions, as Stranger Friends, under the Safeguard of His Majesty's Royal Peace, and entitled to the Protection of the Laws of the Realm, and in no Case treated as Alien Enemies :

His Majesty is further pleased to order, with the Advice aforesaid, that the Ships of the United Kingdom, navigated according to Law, be permitted to repair to the said Islands and Settlements, and to trade with the Inhabitants thereof :

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, with

the Advice aforesaid, that all His Majesty's Cruizers and all other his Subjects be inhibited from committing any Acts of Depredation or Violence against the Persons, Ships, and Goods of any of the Inhabitants of the said Islands and Settlements, and against any Property in the said Islands and Settlements respectively.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice Admiralty, are to take the necessary Measures herein as to them shall respectively pertain.

HIS MAJESTY has been pleased to command that the following Regulations should be established and acted upon in all future Promotions and Appointments in the Commissariat Department, viz.

That the Gradation of Rank be,  
Commissary General,  
Deputy Commissary General,  
Assistant Commissary General,  
Deputy Assistant Commissary General,  
Clerk.

That no Person be allowed to enter the Commissariat but as a Clerk.

That no Clerk be eligible for Promotion until he has served at least *One Year* as Clerk.

That no Deputy Assistant Commissary General be eligible for Promotion until he has served at least *Four Years* as a Deputy Assistant, or *Five Years* from his first entering as a Clerk; in which latter Case, only *One Year's* Service as a Deputy Assistant would be required.

That no Assistant Commissary General be eligible for Promotion until he has served at least *Five Years* as an Assistant, or *Ten Years* from his first entering as a Clerk; in which latter Case, *Two Years' Service* as an Assistant Commissary only would be required.

That no Deputy Commissary General be eligible

for Promotion until he has served at least *Three Years* as Deputy.

By the Term *Service* is to be understood actual Service upon Full-Pay.

Thus, a Commissary General will have  
the Experience of at least - 13 Years,  
A Deputy Commissary General 10  
An Assistant Commissary General 5  
A Deputy Assistant Commissary General 1  
before they can be appointed to their respective Situations.

*Copy of a Letter from Captain Scott, of His Majesty's Ship the Horatio, to John Wilson Croker, Esquire, dated at Sea, February 24, 1810.*

S I R,

I HAVE the Pleasure to acquaint you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that on the Morning of the Twenty-first Instant, being in Latitude 33° 10' N. and Longitude 29° 30' W. we discovered a strange Ship, and after a long Chace, and running Action of One Hour (wherein the Enemy manifested some Determination to defend his Ship,) captured the French Frigate *La Necessité*, of a small Class, pierced for Forty Guns, mounting Twenty-eight, viz. Twenty-two Twelve-Pounders, and Six Twenty-four-Pounder Carronades, with a Hundred and Eighty-six Men, commanded by Monsieur Bernard Bonnie, Lieutenant de Vaisseau, from Brest, bound to the Isle of France with Naval Stores and Provisions.

You will acquaint their Lordships that His Majesty's Ship has not suffered (except a little in her Masts and Rigging) in this trifling Affair; and that the Officers, Ship's Company and Royal Marines behaved to my Satisfaction.

*Copy of a Letter from Captain Sir Joseph Sydney Yorke, of His Majesty's Ship the Christian VII., addressed to Admiral Lord Gambier, and transmitted by his Lordship to John Wilson Croker, Esquire.*

His Majesty's Ship *Christian VII.*, in My Lord, *Basque Roads, Feb. 13, 1810.*

THREE Vessels, as per Margin\*, being Part of a Convoy of Ten Sail, laden with Brandy, Refin, &c. that sailed last Night in thick blowing Weather, Wind W. S.W., from the Charante, bound to the Northward, having got on the Reef that projects from the Point of Chatelaillon, between Aix and Rochelle, I directed the Boats of this Squadron, as per Margin†, to destroy them. This was forthwith attempted to be executed, when the Enemy made a Movement to prevent it. Our Boats were

Eight, and the Enemy's Nine; ours armed in the usual Way, theirs more formidable, all of them being Gun Boats, carrying a Twelve-Pounder Carronade and Six Swivels, and rowing from Twenty to Thirty Oars.

Lieutenant Guion of this Ship, who directed the Operations, made a Feint of Retreating, to decoy the Enemy from their Shore Defences, when suddenly turning on them, they fled. The Barge of this Ship, in which he was, being the fleetest Boat, advanced most gallantly along the Rear of the Enemy's Line to their third Boat; but finding from Circumstances, the Rear Boat was the only one likely to be successfully attacked, he boarded and carried her Sword in Hand. Two others were closely pursued to the Beach by Lieutenant Roberts of the *Armide*, and most from his steady Fire within Pistol Shot have lost Men. The Gun Boat taken by Lieutenant Guion had Two killed and Three wounded; amongst the latter was her Commander feverely. The Vessels alluded to in the Margin were then burnt.

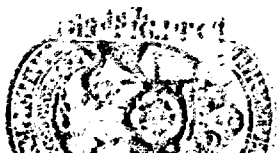

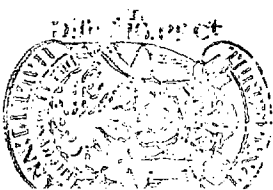
