An Act to enlarge the Term and Powers of Two Acts of His present Majesty, so far as the same relate to the Road from Buckland Dinham to Radford Bridge, and from Midlomer Norton to Norton Saint Phillip, and from Kilmersdon to Radstock, in the County of Somerfet.
