Copy of a Letter from Captain Mends, of His Majefly's Ship the Arethufa, addreffed to Admiral Lord Gambier, and transmitted by his Lordship to John Wilson Croker, Efg.

His Majefly's Ship Arethufa, off the Saints, March 17, 1810.

My LORD, Saints, March 17, 1810. HAVE the Honour to acquaint you of the Capture of La Levrette French Schooner Privateer, of Four Guns and Thirty Men, this Morning, by His Majefty's Ship under my Command; Four Days from Rochelle, without having taken anything.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Maitland, of His Majefly's Ship the Emerald, addreffed to Vice-Admiral Whitfhed, and transmitted by the latter to John Wilfon Croker, Efq.

SIR. Emerald, at Sea, March 23, 1810. HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that His Majeity's Ship Emerald, Yefterday Evening, at Nine o'Clock, took the Belle Etoile, of Marfeilles, a very fine Ship, Letter of Marque, carrying Fiftyfix Men, and Eight Guns, though pierced for Twenty; Four Days out from Bayonne, bound to the Iffe of France, with a Cargo of Wine, Flour, Oil, and various other Merchandize. The Belle Etoile was difcovered from the Maft-Head of this "Ship at Half patt Nine A. M., and the Chafe latted (with a very ftrong Breeze) nearly Twelve Hours; during the latter Part of which fhe threw Four Guns, molt of her Water, and a Part of her Provifions overboard. She is Three Hundred and Fifty Tons Burthen, only Fifteen Months old, had made but one Trip to Guadaloupe, and appears to fail in a molt fuperior Stile.
