The KING's Most Excellent Majetty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between His Majefty's faid Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and published from Time to Time, to authorise, or by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Time being, to authorife, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newtoundland for the then enfuing Seafon only; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, so authorised to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported, except in conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in Such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law.

And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provition be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn and Live Stock, and also Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council,

T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 16th of 1 hereby order and declare, that for the Supply of the Inhabitanes and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn and Live Stock, and also Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine may be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British built Ships owned by His Majelly's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which, within the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of such Importation, have cleared out from some Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cultoms in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinaster mentioned; which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months, from the Day of the Date upon which fuch Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no fuch Licence as aforefaid. granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Majesty is hereby further pleafed to order, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel, to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall upon the Arrival of the said Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour, or Place in the faid Island of Newfoundland, where he shall discharge fuch Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Live Stock, Pitch, Tar and Turpentine, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector, or other proper Officer of the Cultoms there, having first endorsed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Peale, Indian Corn, Pitch, Tar and Turpentine, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the, Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned; and the Col-
