HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was fent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorifed by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Assent agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

Brunswick Wolfenbuttel.

An Act for granting Annuities to discharge an additional Number of Exchequer Bills.

An Act for allowing the Exportation of British and Irish made Malt from one Part of the United

Kingdom to the other.

An Act for altering the Mode of collecting the Duty on Insurances against Loss by Fire, upon Property in His Majesty's Islands and Possessions in the West Indies, and elsewhere beyond the Seas; ,and for exempting certain Bonds and Receipts from Stamp Duty; for giving Relief in certain Cases of Stamps spoiled or missified; and for explaining Part of an Act passed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, for granting Stamp Duties in Great Britain.

An Act for enabling Tenants in Tail, and for Life, and also ecclesiastical Persons, to grant Land for the Purpose of endowing Schools in Ireland.

An Act to repeal certain Parts of several Acts of

the Parliament of Ireland, fo far as relates to the limiting the Number of Persons to be carried by Stage Coaches or other Carriages; for enacting other Limitations in lieu thereof; and for other Purposes relating thereto.

An Act for making and maintaining a navigable Canal from the Union Canal, in the Parish of Gumley, in the County of Leicester, to join the Grand Junction Canal near Long Buckby, in the County of Northampton, and for making a collateral Cut-from the faid intended Canal. An Act for making and maintaining a Rail-way from Howler Stade, in the Forest of Dean, in the County of Gloucester, to the Town of Monmouth; and for making other Railways therein mentioned, in the Counties of Gloucester and Mon-

An Act for making and maintaining a Tunnel or Road under the River Severn, from the Parish of Newnham to the Parish of Arlingham, in the County

An Act for improving the Drainage of certain Lands within the North and South-West Parts of the Middle Level, Part of the Great Level of the Fens commonly called Bedford Level.

An Act for inclosing Lands in the Parish of Leverton, in the County of Lincoln; and for providing for the Repair of a certain Sea Bank within the

faid Parish.

An Act for inclosing Lands in the Parish of Leake, in the County of Lincoln; and for providing for the Repair of the new Sea Bank within the faid Parish.

An Act for amending, enlarging and rendering more effectual an Act passed in the Eleventh Year of King George the Second, for the effectual draining and preserving of a certain Fen called Cawdle Fen, and other Fen Grounds in the Isle of Ely, in

the County of Cambridge.

An Act for amending and rendering more effectual an Act of His present Majesty, for dividing and allotting certain Fens called the East and West Fens, in the County of Lincoln; and for dividing and inclosing the parochial Allotments, Lands and Grounds belonging to and in certain Parishes having Right of Common on the faid Fens; and for de-claring to what Parishes such Allotments shall belong.

An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act of His present Majesty, for erecting a new Church to be called Christchurch, in the Town of Birmingham, in the County of Warwick; and for providing a Maintenance and Residence for the Minister or perpetual Curate thereof.

An Act for amending an Act passed in the Thirty-sirst Year of His present Majesty, for the better Relief and Employment of the Poor within the Hundreds of Loes and Wilford, in the County

of Suffolk.

An Act for the more equally affelling and collect-

ing the Poor Rates within the Hamlet of Mile End Old Town, in the Parish of Saint Dunstan Stebon-Heath, otherwise Stepney, in the County of Middlesex, to alter, enlarge, or repair a Workhouse or Workhouses of the said Hamlet, and managing the Concerns thereos.

An Act for better regulating the Statute-Labour

in the County of Forfar.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the West Middlesex Waterworks to raise a surther Sum of Money; and to alter, vary, amend and enlarge the Powers of the Act passed in the Fortyfixth Year of His present Majesty, for making the said Waterworks, and for extending the same.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road from Buckingham, through Brackley, to join the Daventry Turnpike Road near Banbury.

An Act to amend an Act passed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Thirtieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, for repairing the Turnpike Road

leading from Kinnegad to Athlone.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers, of Two Acts of His prefent Majesty, for repairing certain Roads lying in the Counties of Leicester and Warwick, and in the County of the City of Coventry; and for amending and keeping in Repair the Road from Bourne Bridge to Blythe Bridge, in the County of Warwick

An Act for making and maintaining a Road from a Place called Yitrad, in the Parish of Lanfabon, in the County of Glamorgan, to Pontymoil, near the Town of Pontypool, in the County of Monmouth, with a collateral Branch to join the Newport Turnpike Road at Risca, in the County of Monmouth; and for building a Bridge at or near Ystrad aforesaid, and another Bridge near Penllwyn, in the County of Monmouth.

An Act for more effectually repairing the Roads

in the County of Forfar.

An Act for making and maintaining a Road from Brandlesome Moss Gate, in the Township of Elton, to the Duke of York's Public House, in the Township of Blackburn, and three several Branches of Road therefrom, all in the County-Palatine of Lancaster.

HE following Addresses of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland having been been transmitted by Francis Lord Napigr, His Majesty's Commissioner, to the Right Honourable Richard Ryder, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, have been by him presented to the King, which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

May it please your Majesty,

THE gracious Letter, with which your Majesty has been pleased to honour the present General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, was received with the most lively Sentiments of Respect and Gratitude.

We regard with no common Satisfaction the Affurance which your Majelly has thought fit to give us, that you deem it good for the Propagation of Reformed Religion that the General Assembly of our National Church should hold their annual Meet-

ing at the appointed Period; at the same Time we feel this high Expression of your Confidence, as a most powerful Incitement to us to conduct our Proceedings with that Gravity and Calmness which may best promote an Object of such great Importance. Confidering the Representation of your Royal Perfon in our General Assemblies as the Symbol of that Union between Church and State which tends to give Vigour and Stability to both, we receive as a pleasing Testimony of your paternal Affection for the Church of Scotland, the Appointment of Lord Napier to be your Majetly's Commissioner, and are prepared, by the Experience of the Zeal and Fidelity which have heretofore marked his character in the Execution of his important Trust, and secured to him the Attention and Approbation of the Members of our Body, to receive with all Earnestness the important and holy Exhortations with which, on this Occasion, your Majetty has found it more especially necessary to charge him.

The renewed Assurance which he has most im-pressively conveyed to us of your Majesty's firm and unalterable Attachment to the Doctrines of the Christian Religion, and of your constant and tender Regard for the peculiar Privileges of the Church of Scotland, reminds us of the inestimable Bleffings which we enjoy under the just and beneficent Administration of a King, who, through a long Reign, has been the nurling Father of the Church, and no less folicitous for the spiritual than the temporal Interest of his people. We are anxious to justify the Hope which your Majesty is pleased to entertain of this General Assembly, by continuing still to preser to all Objects that can solicit our Attention, the Precepts which our holy Faith recommends, and to practice with unshaken Constancy the Conduct which it approves, the beneficial Influence of which we have long feen under the fincere and effectual Protection which your Majesty has afforded to us in the Propagation of them.

We are deeply convinced that the Adoption of wild and speculative Notions, entertained by misguided Men, and the manifest Errors which prevail among us in these Times, are justly ascribed to the Neglect of the salutary Principles and holy Laws of our Divine Religion; and, in Obedience to your paternal Call, and in Fulfilment of the Duties of our screed Office, we solemnly pledge ourselves to your Majesty, that, through the Grace of the Lord Jesus, we will lend ourselves with all Assiduity and Vigilance to correct these Errors, and to expose the salues

cious Profpects which are held out to captivate the Weak and feduce the Unwary.

It is our determined Resolution, that if the specious Theories of false Philosophy and the persevering Efforts of her Advocates, are offered to the Admiration of the People entrusted to our Charge, we will most affectionately teach them to avoid the Councils of Hypocrify, and to follow rather the Example of those that do well. We shall not fail to guard them against the violent and intemperate Followers of pretended Patriotism, shewing them what Manner of Men they are, and setting before them the sober Demeanor and earnest Endeavours of the true Friends of the Gospel, striving by sound Principles and pure Morals to continue and increase that public Happiness which we have derived from our envied Constitution. By an Appeal to the History of past Ages and the Experience of the present Times, we shall

labour to convince all Men of the Advantages which refult from a due and proper Obedience to the Laws and Ordinances which Wildom has established; happy if by the Sobriety of our Lives we shall be favoured, like the faithful Men who have gone before us, as the Instruments of Divine Providence in discouraging the Principles which tend only to the Subversion of

all good Government and focial Order.

From the great Experience of your Majesty's faithful Representative in these and other Matters, which concern the Interests of our Church, we confidently expc& high Encouragement in the Discharge of the difficult Duties recommended to us by your Majesty. He has fully satisfied us of your Majesty's Determination to support us under every discouraging Embarrassment, and of your Royal Conviction that by timely Caution and the firm and prudent Conduct recommended to us by your Majesty, our public Miniffrations may be bleffed of God to make the virtuous and uprigit more feedfalt, and to reclaim those who may for a Time have wandered in Search of pernicious Novelties.

Firmly convinced of the indiffoluble Connection which must ever subsist between the temporal Welfare of a People and the faithful Discharge of their more facred Duties, we shall exert our most strenuous Endeavours to maintain and improve that happy Union by impressing a just Sense of the blessed Effects of it upon the Minds of all those that are committed to our Care; admonishing them, as they value the diftinguishing Privileges of an excellent and admired Constitution, to cultivate and extend the Obfervance of those spiritual Obligations which alone can render these Blessings permanent or themselves

happy.

The condescending and indulgent Communication of the pious and benevolent Sentiments by which your Majesty is animated at this momentous Crisis, has made a deep Impression on our Hearts; binding us by new Ties of Affection to your Majesty's Perfon, and calling forth a more ardent Zeal in behalf of your Government. While we feel that, from the general Aspect of the Times, our Duties as Pastors of the Church of Scotland are multiplied, and that our Responsibility is increased, we feel alsot hat our Minds are invigorated by the firm Reliance which your Majesty is pleased to repose in our Wildom and Fidelity.

We rejoice in the renewed Affurance, that the Good of the Church and the Welfare of your People are the Objects of your Majesty's constant and most anxious Care; and we have learned, from long Experience, that no Services are more acceptable to your Royal Mind than those which are conducive to these great Ends of your Government. this Impression, we shall labour with united Essort to promote by our Deliberations the particular Interests of the Church of Scotland, and the Prosperity and Happiness of that Portion of your Subjects who have been accustomed to receive from it, through us, the wholesome Precepts of the Gospel.

We receive your Majesty's Royal Donation for the Propagation of Christian Knowledge and the Principles of the Reformed Religion, in the Highlands and Islands of Scotland, as a pleasing Expresfion of your Majesty's unremitted Attention to the best Interests of your People. It shall be our Care to secure, by a faithful Application of this Bounty the valuable Objects for which it has been bestowed.

That Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, may protect your Majelly's Person, and prosper the Administration of your Government; that he may bless abundantly our Gracious Queen, the Prince and Princels of Wales, and all the Members of your illustrious House; and that, after a long and happy Reign over a loyal and affectionate People, you may at length be received to the Glory of the Heavenly Kingdom, are, through Jesus Christ, the united and fervent Prayers of, May it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most obedient, and most loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders met in this National Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

May it please your Majesty,
WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, met in General Assembly, embrace the first Opportunity of approaching our Gracious Sovereign, to join in those heartlest Congratulations which were lately to univerfally expressed by an attached and loyal People, on the Fiftieth Anniverlary of your Majesty's Accession to the Throne of these Kingdoms. Satisfied that a virtuous and religious King is one of the greatest Bleffings which the Almighty can bellow upon a Nation, we regard your Majesty's lengthened Reign as a peculiar Mark of the Favour of Heaven, for which we are grateful to God, who has added this to the many diffinguishing Advantages confered upon us as a People. During nearly Half a Century, your Majesty's Subjects have had displayed to them from the Throne, an Example of every public and private Virtue; an Example which has excited their Respect and Veneration, and by its powerful Influence has been of incalculable lenefit in promoting their Happinels.

Your Majesty has been called to discharge the Duties of a highly important Station, in one of the most eventful Periods to be found in History; a Period during which ancient Inflitutions have been destroyed, Thrones levelled with the Ground, and all the Relations which had for Ages connected the great Commonwealth of Europe torn afunder. In the midit of this general Convultion, Britain, under the auspicious Rule of a wife and just Monarch, has remained fecure. Her unrivalled Constitution has been preserved—her Territory enlarged—her Com-merce, under the Sheker of a triumphant Navy. spread to the most disant Regions - her Agriculture and Manufactures carried to an unexampled Degree of Perfection, whillt the peaceful Pursuits of Literature and Science have been fostered, the pure Administration of Justice secured, and the Temples of Religion, where our Fathers worshipped, untouched by the Hand of Sacrilege, have remained open to their Pollerity, to offer up their Adorations to the Author of these varied Gifts. This envied Situation, Sire, in which Providence has been pleafed to place our Country, cannot fail of heing truly gratifying to a Sovereign who, as the Father of his Feople, rejoices in their Happinels; and this Gratification must be greatly increased by the Resection, that your Majesty's conscientious and faithful Difcharge of your high Duties has contributed fo largely

many Bleffings.

Among the various Circumstances which have marked an eventful Reign, there is not one more honourable to your Majetty's Feelings, or which reflects a brighter Lustre on the British Character, than the Affistance which has been so liberally afforded to suffering Nations, struggling to rescue themselves from the Grasp of lawless Ambition. The Exertions made by your Majesty for this Purpose, have proved to the World, that Britain is ready - to expend her Blood, as well as Treasure, in succouring her Allies. Whilft the successful Valour of your Troops, opposed to such superior Numbers, has confirmed the Expectations of the most fanguine, inspired the timid with Considence, and taught a vaunting Foe how hopeless would be the Attempt to combat Freemen on their native Soil. Whatever, under Divine Providence, may be the Fate of the other Nations of Europe, your Subjects will have the Confolation to think, that following your Majesty's illustrious Example, they acted the Part which became a great and generous Nation; and no Page in History will be read by Posterity with greater Exultation than that which records, that Britons were the only People who dared, in defiance of a powerful Usurper, to extend their Arm for the Protection of the Oppressed; whilst their Country remained the only Asylum where the unfortunate Exile found a Resuge from the Effects of his sanguinary Vengeance.

Amidst the general Benefits in which we participate with our Fellow-Subjects, we recollect, with the liveliest Emotions, the peculiar Marks of Royal Fa-vour which this National Church has experienced during your Majelty's Reign; and knowing that the faithful Discharge of our facred Duties is the Expression of Gratitude most acceptable to your Majesty, we renew the Pledge often given, to be zealous in our Endeavours to cherish and strengthen those Principles of Loyalty to the King, and Attachment to the Constitution, by which the People under our Care have long been animated; and to impress deeply upon their Minds those Sentiments of Religion and Virtue which are the true Source of private Happi-

. ness and national Greatness.

That Almighty God, the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, may prolong your Majesty's Life, and prosper your Administration; that he may bless the Queen, the Prince and Princess of Wales, and all your Royal Family; and that, after a prosperous Reign upon Earth, you may obtain a Crown of Glory; is the earnest Prayer of, May it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most obedient, and most loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders met in this General Assembly, of the Church _of Scotland.

SIR INCLOSE, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Copy of a Letter from Lieutenant Peter Proctor, an old Officer of much Merit, commanding His Majesty's Schooner the Thistle, detailing the Account of an - Action with the Dutch National Corvette De Havik, commanded by a Lieutenant of Marine. The Prize is a large East India built Ship, of very war-like Appearance, and the good Conduct and Bravery displayed by Lieutenant Proctor, his Officers and Men, in attacking a Ship of her Size and Force, and their Perseverance under many Disficulties, will, . I trust, entitle them to their Lordships' Favour.

Thiftle, at Sea, February 11, 1810. YESTERDAY Morning we have in Sight of a Ship, which, upon being chased, maneuvred suspiciously, and excited our best Endeavours to come up with her. After a Chace to Windward of Seven Hours and a Half, the Superior Sailing of His Maesty's Schooner under my Command brought us alongside; and the Moment I hailed, the Stranger . hoisted. Dutch Colours, commenced Action, and attempted to run us down; we were fully prepared to meet him, and avoiding his Bows, continued to engage fo chofely, and with fuch good Effect, that, in the Course of an Hour, the Enemy made Sail and endeavoured to escape before the Wind; we were thus brought into running Fight for Four Hours, when I had the Pleasure to find the Ba-, tavian Flag was hauled down, being hailed that they had struck.

On taking Possession of our Capture, we found the was the Dutch National Corvette de Havik. commanded by Mynher J. Sterling. Lieutenant of Marine, mounting Ten Guns, pierced for Eighteen. with Fifty-two Men, and having on hoard the Batavian Admiral Buyskes, with his Suite, Inte Lieutenant-Governor and Commander in Chief at Batavia, from that : Island bound to New York, and partly loaded with Spices and Indigo.

One Man on board the Enemy was killed, the Admiral and Seven Men hadly wounded. The Lofe on the Part of the Thiffle was Samuel Hobbs, a Private Marine, killed, myself and Six Men wounded.

At an early Part of the Action Three of our Carronades were dismounted, but the gallant Conduct of every one of my Crew readily replaced this Damage, bravely emulating each other in supporting the Superiority of the British Flag.

The said Letter also contains the most gross, scandalous, and indecent Expressions, addressed to bis Lordship.

His Majesty, for the bitter apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perjons concerned in Writing and fending the faid Letter, is bereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually wrote the same,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, She, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
