THE King has been pleased to cause it to be fignified, by the Most Noble the Marquis Wellesley, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, to the Ministers of friendly and neutral Powers reliding at this Court, that the

necessary Measures have been taken by His Majesty's Command, for the Blockade of the Port of Elfineur, and that from this Time all the Measures authorized by the Laws of Nations, and the respective Treaties between His Majesty and the disserent neutral Powers, will be adopted and executed, with respect to all Vessels which may attempt to violate the faid Blockade.

PRESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Twentyvv eighth Year of the Reign of His present Ma-jesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between, His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the Welt Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enasted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesly in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and published from Time to Time, to authorife, or by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Time being, 20 authorife, in case of Necessity, the Im-portation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, In-dian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the then ensuing Season only; provided always, that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, so authorised to be imported into the Island of Newsoundland, shall not be imported, except in conformity to such Rules,

spectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law.

And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provition be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn and Live Stock, and also Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declire, that for the Supply of the Inhabicants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon only, Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn and Live Stock, and also Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine may be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships owned by His Majelly's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which, within the Space of Nine Months pre-vious to the Time of such Importation, have cleared out from Iome Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majesty's Do-minions in Europe, for which Purpole a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majelty's Cultoms in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majelty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinaster mentioned; which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months, from the Day of the Date upon which such Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforesaid. granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Esset: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel, to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour, or Place in the faid Island of Newsoundland, where he shall discharge fuch Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Live Stock, Pitch, Tar and Turpentine, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector, or other proper Officer be imported, except in conformity to such Rules, of the Customs there, having first endorsed on the Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in Back of such Licence the Marks, Numbers and such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, reIndian Corn, Pitch, Tar and Turpentine, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned; and the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cultoms at Newfoundland, is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel, of his having received the faid Licence fo endorfed as before directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland respectively, by whom such Licence was granted.

TICE ADMIRAL SIR JAMES SAUMAREZ has transmitted to John Wilson Croker, Efq; 2 Letter he had received from Captain Reynolds, of His Majesty's Ship the Tribune, giving an Account of his having, on the 12th Instant, fallen in, off Mandal, on the Coalt of Norway, with Four Danish Brigs, Two of Twenty Guns each, One of Eighteen, and One of Sixteen, which, after a severe Action of Two Hours, made all possible Sail for the Shore, and owing to the Damages fullained by the Tribune in her Sails, and the want of Wind, escaped amongst the Rocks.

Eight Men and One Boy (named in the Margin*) were killed on board the Tribune, and Thirteen Men wounded. The Lofs of the Enemy is

supposed to have been confiderable.
