Stamp-Office, June 8, 1810.

AN Act of Parliament (50 Geo. 3. c. 35) having lately passed relating to certain Duties under the Management of the Commissioners of Stamps, whereby they are authorised to allow and exchange Stamps, spoiled or misused, on Deeds and written Instruments, in certain Cases not before provided for, so that Application be made within a limited Time; Notice is hereby given thereof, in order that all Solicitors, Stationers, and others concerned, may inform themselves of the particular Provisions of the Act, and make Application for Relief within the Time prescribed, in Default whereof their Claims will be disallowed. The same Act also contains a Clause for explaining the Stamp Act, 48 Geo. 3. c. 149, and the Schedule thereto, so far as regards the Exemption of certain Leases, in consideration of Fines paid for the same, from the ad valorem Duties on Conveyances upon the Sale of Lands, &c.; whereof all Persons concerned are desired to take Notice.
