WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twentieth Day of December last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom that the Gid Prohibition should be continued dom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majelty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Mouths, from the said Eleventh Day of July next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, An-chors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bow-fprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirtythird Year of His Majelty's Reign, intituled " An " Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Expor-" tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to " prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and "Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:" But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained thall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or

Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vellel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vesfel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purpole of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Ma-jesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, (except as here-inafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commisfioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Majelty's Pleasure, nevertheless, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Greafe, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to

any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majesty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles so exported are intended for the Use of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the faid. Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the faid Articles during the same Season; and provided also that the Exportation of the said Articles shall, in no Case, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the fame Season: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appetrain. the Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty intithe Forty-fourth Year of His present Majesty, inti-tuled "An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign thips, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irith Ships; which, by an Act made in the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, was revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thouland eight hundred and fix, and extended to Goat-Skins imported in Foreign Ships; and which was further continued by an Act made in the Forty-seventh Year of His present Ma-jesty, until the Twenty-sisth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight, should be, and the same was thereby further continued until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace: And whereas, by the said Acts, it is lawful for His Majesty, by His Order in Council, from Time to Time, when and as often as it may be judged expedient, to permit any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and also Goat-Skins, to be imported in any Foreign Ship or Vessel, and to be admitted to Entry in any Port or Place in the United Kingdom, on Payment of such and the like Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel, any Thing contained in any Act to the contrary notwithstanding: His Majelly is thereupon pleased, by and with the

Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers vested in His Majesty by the faid above recited Acts, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for the Space of Six Months from the Date of this His Majesty's Order in Council, the Importation of Hides, or Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf Skins, or Pieces of Calf Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and also of Goat-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, in any Foreign Ship or Vessel, from any Fort from which the British Flag is excluded; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Vessel, from any Port from which the British Flag is excluded, with any of the Articles above mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accord-W. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's VV Order in Council of the Twenty-second Day of November 1ast, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatloever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Sixth Day of June next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forseitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An" Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the
Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit
the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower " His Majelly to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or " Ammunition :"-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

WE, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Justice, Recorder, Vicar, Burgesses, and other Inhabitants of the Town, Borough, and Parish of Okehampton, cannot omit the Opportunity, which the present Situation of foreign and domestic Politics assords, of humbly approaching Your Majelty with our fincere and heartfelt Affurances of Loyalty and Attachment to Your Majesty's Person and Family.

We cannot observe, without the utmost Concern and Indignation, the Attempts of mischievous and misguided Men to bring the Decisions of the Legislature into Contempt, which, by sapping the Foundation of the happy System of Legislation, which cost our Ancestors such Exertions and so much Blood to erect, may eventually enable them to effect the overthrow of that splendid Fabric of human Policy, the British Constitution; which is not only the purest Form of Government that ever existed, and the most fortunate to live under, but far furpasses any Thing which the Ingenuity of indi-vidual Invention could have conceived, or the most sanguine Friend of rational Freedom could ever hope to see realized.

Under the specious Pretext of desending our Liberties, we are called upon to sanction such Innovations upon the Constitution as would endanger our Religion, our Liberties, and our Laws. - We truft, however, that the good Sense of the British Nation will enable them clearly to see through these Defigns, and that by giving their decided Support to the Constitution as by Law established, they will effectually protect it from the Attacks of foreign as well as domeltic Enemies

We beg, therefore, to assure Your Majesty, that we feel perfect Confidence in the Wildom of Parliament, and in the recent Assurance that Your Majesty will not be wanting in the Discharge of Your

Duty to preserve domestic Peace and Tranquillity under the Protection of the Law.

That the Bleffings of the British Constitution may be transmitted unimpaired to Pollerity, and that Your Majesty and Your illustrious Descendants, imitating Your Virtues, may long continue to reign over this happy and free People will ever be the Prayer of Your, Majesty's most dutiful and loyal-Subjects.

1st. Reading English, and writing it with Facility from Dictation.

Rule of Three in whole Numbers, and also in Vulgar and Decimal Fractions.

3d. The first Three Books of Euclid's Elements' by R. Simfon, with the Exception of Propositions 42, 44, 45, Book I. and of Propositions 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, Book II. In this Part of the Examinations, befides giving the most precise Demonstrations, the Candidates will be expected to make the Constructions in a practical Manner with Compasses and a Ruler.

4th. The French Language, a Knowledge of which, although not absolutely required in the Candidates who may present themselves at the first Examination which is to be held, will nevertheless give a Preserence to those, who are in all other Respects equally qualified; at all subsequent Examinations, however, the Candidates will be required to read and translate French with Facility.

After Admission into the Superior Class, the Apprentices shall attend at the Royal Naval College Three or Four Hours on the Mornings of every Day in the Week, except Sunday and the established Holidays, where they shall be instructed in such Parts of the following Subjects as shall appear to the Professor of the College to be best adapted to the Object of the Establishment, viz. the Formation of able and useful Ship Builders:

Geometry Fluxions Theory of Naval Algebra Plane Trigonometry Architecture. Drawing Mechanics The French Language. Hydrollatics.

On Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays, the Apprentices shall be employed at the College during the Hours above-mentioned, in the Study of Mathematics, under the Professor or the Instructor; on Thursday and Friday Mornings in Drawing, under the Drawing Master, the Art of Perspective being most particularly applied in drawing the different Parts of a Ship; and the Morning of Saturday shall be appropriated to the Study of such Books and Exercises in the French Language, under the French Matter, as may perfect them therein, and at the fame Time advance their professional Knowledge. This Division of Time allotted for their Studies, is, 2d. The first Four Rules of Arithmetic, and the I however, to be subject to such Alterations as shall

In the remaining Part of the Day, when not attending at the College, they shall be employed under the Master Shipwright or Instructor of Naval Archi tecture, in the Mould Loft, in the various Kinds of manual Labour connected with Ship-building; in the Acquirement of a complete Knowledge of the different Parts of a Ship, and of the Method of constructing and fastening the same, as well as in discriminating her different Properties deducible from theoretical Calculations; also in the Management and Conversion of Timber, and generally, in such other Manner as the Master Shipwright may consider as best adapted to make them fully acquainted with all the Detail of the Duties of a practical Shipwright.

The last Year of their Apprenticeship, or such Part thereof as the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty may think proper, shall be served at Sea, in such of His Majesty's Ships as their Lordships shall direct, with a view of obtaining some practical Knowledge in the steering, sailing, trimming, and ballasting of a Ship, in making Remarks on the Motion and working of a Ship, in all her Parts, in bad Weather, and on a high Sea, the standing and straining of the Masts and Yards under such Circumstances, the placing of the fixed Blocks, with a view to the proper leading of Ropes, &c. and, generally, in obtaining fuch Information, as the Captain, Carpenter, and other Officers of the Ship may, by their Experience, communicate, and such as their own Observations may suggest.
