HEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Forty-WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-eighth Year of His Majelty's Reign, initialed An Act for further continuing, until Three Months after the Rajification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His prefent Majelty, for permitting the Importation into Great Britain of Hides and other Articles in Foreign Ships," it is enacted, that an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His prefent Majelty inti 1.12. the Foreign Snips, "It is enacted, that an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His prefent Majefty, inti-tuled "An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May, One thouland eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) in Foreign ships, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irith Ships, which, by an Act made in the Porty-fifth Year of His prefent Majefty; was "revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thouland eight hundred and fix, and extended to Goat-Skins imported in Foreign Ships; and which was further continued by an Act made in the Forty-leventh Year of His prefent Ma-jeffy, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight, should be. and the fame was thereby further continued until Three Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace: And whereas, by the faid Acta, it is lawful for His Majefty, by His Order in Council, from Time to Time, when and as often as it may be judged expedient, to permit any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf Skips, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Can-Skins, diened of underled, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and alfo Goat-Skins, to be im-ported in any Foreign Ship or Veffel, and to be admitted to Entry in any Port or Place in the United Kingdom, on Payment of fuch and the like Duties of Cuftoms and Excife as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any Britifh or Irith-built Ship or Veffel, any Thing contained in any Act to the contrary notwithstanding : His Majelly is thereupon pleafed, by and with the

Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers vested in His Majesty by the faid above recited Acts, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for the Space of Six Months from the Date of this His Majefty's Order in Council, the Importation of Hides, or Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed, Calf Skins, or Pieces of Calf Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool, (except Cotton Wool,) and also of Goat-Skins, dreffed or undreffed, in any Foreign Ship or Veffel, from any Fort from which the Britifh Flag is excluded ; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Veffel, from any Port from which the Britifh Flag is excluded, with any of the Articles above mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the fame Duties of Cuftoms and Excife as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Veffel.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiflioners of His Majefty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. WHEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the 18th of October laft, to direct that all fuch Ships or Veffels as were or should be bound to the Port of Liverpool, or any Creek or Place belonging to or within the faid Port, from any Place or Places from whence Quarantine is required to be performed, should perform their Quarantine in Bromborough Pool, inflead of Highlake, as prescribed by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 5th of April 1805; and whereas, it is deemed expedient that the faid Order of the 18th of October last flould not be confined to Ships or Veffels liable to Quarantine, bound to the Port of Liverpool, or any Creek or Place belonging to or within the faid Port, but thould be extended to Ships and Veffels; liable to Quarantine as aforefaid. bound to the Ports of Carlille, Whitehaven, Lancafter, Preston, Chester, Beaumaris, and the Isle of Man, and any Creeks or Places belonging to or within any or either of the above Ports, which Ships or Veffels are directed by His Majelty's faid Order in Council of the 5th of April 1805, to perform their Quarantine at Highlake, or at Milford Haven; His Majefty is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, that not only all fuch Ships and Veffels as are or fhall be bound to the Port of Liverpool, or any Creek or Place belonging to or within the faid Port, but alfo all Ships and Veffels bound to the Ports of Carlifle, Whitehaven, Lancaster, Preston, Chester, Beaumaris, and the Isle of Man, and any Creek or Place belonging to or within any or either of the faid Ports, shall in future perform their Quarantine at Bromborough Pool, inftead of Highlake or at Milford Haven.
