THE Principal Officers and Commitfiemers of His ĺ A Majefts's Navy bereby give Notice, that a Plan of Education has been eftablished, at the Royal Naval College at His Majelly's Dock Yard at Portymoush, for a Superior Class of Apprentices to Shipwrights.

That the Number of Students in the Superior Clais of Shipwrights' Apprentices shall, in the first Instance, be limited to Twelve, but will gradually be encreased to Twenty-five. The period of Apprenticeship shall be Seven Years, but for a Student who may have previoufly ferved in the Inferior Clafs of Apprentices in His Majelty's Yards for the Space of Two Years, it shall be only Six Years, and only Five Years for a Scudent who may have previously ferved in the faid Clafs for the Space of Three Years.

An Instructor in the Theory of Naval Archi-tecture will be added to the prefent Establishment of the Royal Naval College, to affift particularly in the Iultruction of this Clafs of Apprentices.

The Candidates for Admiffion mult produce Certificates from two refpectable Phylicians or Surgeons that they are of found Health and Conflication, and likewise Proof from the Register of the Parish in which they were born, of their being at least Fifteen, and not more than Seventeen Years of Age, excepting Candidates from among the Shipwrights' Apprentices of the Yard, who may be admitted if they fhall not have ferved more than Three Years of their Time. Candidates fhall be examined on the firit Wednelday in November in each Year, by the Profeffor of the Royal Naval College, affitted by the Inftructor in the Theory of Naval Architecture, in the Prefence of the Commiffioner of the Yard, the Lieutenant Governor of the College, and Malter Shipwright, who shall jointly report the Refult of the Examination to the Lords Commiflioners of the Admiralty, carefully inferting the Names of the Candidates in Succeffion according to their refoetive Mevits.
