The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council.

HIS Majelty having been plealed to appoint His Grace Henry Charles Duke of Beaufort, K.G. to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Gloucester, of the City of Briftol, and County of the fame, and of the City of Gloucester, and County of the fame; His Grace this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereipon, inflead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

### Admiralty-Office, August 25, 1810.

ExtraB of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir James Saumarez, Bart. and K. B. to John Wilfon Croker, Efg; dated on board His Majefy's Ship Victory, in Hano Bay, the Ifl Inflant.

LIEUTENANT TEMPLER, commanding the Earneft Gun-Brig, has captured a Danish Cutter Privateer, of Two Guns and Thirteen Men, in the Cattegat, on the 28th Ultimo: and the Boats of the Cenfor, Lieutenant Lucas, cut out a French Privateer Sloop from the Harbour of Strallund, on the 25th; fhe is pierced for Four Guns, with a Crew of Forty Men, Three of whom only were on board.

The Martial Gun-Brig has captured a Row-Boat Privateer belonging to Barnholm, with Twelve Men; and the Swan Cutter has this Morning brought in another Row-Boat of the fame Defeription, with Eleven Men, one of whom was killed, another wounded, in attempting to make their Escape, and also recaptured a Galliot which she had taken.

The Gentlemen to wear Black Coats and Black or plain White, or White and Gold, or White and Silver Stuff Wailcoats, full-trimmed, coloured Swords and Buckles.

And on Sunday, the 16th of September next, the Court to go out of Mourning.
