

an Act, for amending, altering, explaining, extending, and making more effectual an Act, passed in the Fortieth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for more effectually repairing, widening, and improving the Road from the Village of Magor to the Bridge Foot, in the Town of Chepstow, in the County of Monmouth, and several other Roads in the Counties of Monmouth, Gloucester, Hereford, and Brecon, to continue in force for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament;" and particularly to enable the Trustees of that Division of the said Roads called the Third District, or District of Newport, to make and maintain a new Road from the Bottom of a certain Hill or Place called Fair Oak-Hill, in the Parish of Christchurch, in the said County of Monmouth, to the Village of Magor, in the said County of Monmouth, to join the Road there leading from the said Village of Magor to the Town of Chepstow; which said Road will pass into and through the several Parishes of Christchurch, Lanwern, Bishton, the Hamlet of Llandevenny, the Parish of Magor, and the Extra-parochial Place called Green Moor, in the said County of Monmouth; also to enable the said Trustees of the Newport District to increase the Tolls, and to raise and borrow a Sum of Money for making the said Road, and also Power to erect One or more Gate or Gates on such Parts of the said intended Road leading from the Bottom of Fair Oak-Hill to the Village of Magor, at such Places as the said Trustees may think proper, and to take and receive thereat such Tolls as by the said intended Act they shall be empowered to take, notwithstanding such Gate or Gates may be situate within the Distance of Eight Miles of some other Gate at which the said Tolls shall have been paid or become payable; and also to repeal, alter, and amend the several Powers and Provisions of the said Act, so far as the same relate to and affect the said Third District, or District of Newport, and in lieu thereof to obtain such other Powers and Provisions as shall be deemed expedient for the more effectually improving, widening, making, altering, and maintaining such Parts of the Roads described in the said Act which lay in the Third District, or District of Newport.
