BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to alter and amend an Act passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for rendering more commodious, and for better regulating the Port of London, so far as the same relates to the Concerns of the West India Dock Company thereby established; and for extending to other Objects the Compensations directed to be made by the said Act;" it is amongst other Things enacted as follows:

And be it further enacted, that when any one or more of the said Docks by the said recited Act and this Act authorized to be made, and built by the said Directors, with the Basin or Basins, Quays, Wharfs, Warehouses; and other Works belonging or to belong thereto, shall be so far completed that in the Judgement of the Lord High Treasurer, or any Three or more of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, the same shall be fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods respectively; it shall be lawful for the said Lord High Treasurer, or any Three or more of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, and he and they are hereby respectively authorized and empowered by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known the same; which Certificate shall be published Three Times at the least in the London Gazette, and in Two or more Morning Papers then usually circulated in London; and the said Certificate so published shall be deemed sufficient

Notice to all Parties interested, of the Completion of the Dock or Docks, Quays, Wharfs, Warehouses, and other Works, concerning which such Certificate of Approbation shall be made, and from and after such Certificate of Approbation shall be made; and from and after the Expiration of Ten Days next ensuing the first Publication of the said Certificate in Manner aforesaid, all the Rates and Duties by the said recited Act and this Act made payable to the said West India Dock Company, for Ships and Vessels entering into and using any of the said Docks, or any of the Basins or Cuts belonging or which shall belong thereto, and also for any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize which shall be landed or discharged from any Ship or Vessel lying within any of the said Docks, or any of the Basins or Cuts belonging, or which shall belong thereto, shall commence, take effect, and become payable; and then and from thenceforth such of the Quays and Wharfs then made and built by the said Company, as shall be described in such Certificate to be fit for the Reception of Goods, shall be deemed and taken to be legal Quays and Wharfs accordingly; and all the Provisions in the said recited Act contained relating to the Increase of Interest or Dividends from and after the Completion of the said Docks, Cuts, Quays, Wharfs, Warehouses, and other Works; and for compelling Ships and Vessels that shall arrive in the River Thames with West India Produce on board, to unload and land the whole of such Produce within some or one of the said Docks, or on the Quays or Wharfs belonging, or which shall belong thereto; and for causing the King's Duties in respect to the same to be ascertained at such Quays or Wharfs, and not elsewhere; and compelling such Ships and Vessels belonging to or frequenting the Port of London, as shall be used or employed in the West India Trade, to ship or take in their respective Cargoes, and be loaded either in some or one of the said Docks, or in such Part of the River Thames as shall be below the Entrance into the intended Canal at Blackwall aforesaid, shall take effect and be in full Force and Operation; and the said Term of Twenty-one Years, during which the aforesaid Provisions are to be in force, shall commence at and be computed from the Expiration of Ten Days from the Time of the first Publication of the said Certificate as before-mentioned, any thing in the said recited Act contained to the contrary notwithstanding:

And whereas by seven several Certificates under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, bearing Date respectively the 21st Day of August 1802, the 22d Day of August 1803, the 29th Day of November 1803, the 5th Day of July 1805, the 24th Day of June 1806, the 25th Day of September 1807, and the 21st Day of October 1808, the Docks, Entrance Basins, Quays, Wharfs, and Warehouses therein specified and described, belonging to the said West India Dock Company, were certified to be fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods respectively, as required by the said Acts of Parliament:

And whereas an additional Warehouse hereinafter described, having since been erected by the said West India Dock Company, for the further Accommodation of the West India Trade; we the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do

in pursuance of the said Act of the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, further certify and make known, that the large Warehouse made and erected by the said West India Dock Company, under the Authority of the said Acts of Parliament, on the East End of the Import Dock of the said Company, is so far completed that in our Judgment the same is fit for the Reception of Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, and we do hereby declare our Approbation of the said Warehouse accordingly.

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for permitting certain Goods, imported into Great Britain, to be secured in Warehouse, without Payment of Duty," it is amongst other things enacted, as follows: That it shall be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Consignee or Consignees, of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes enumerated or described in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (A); and which shall be legally imported and brought into the Port of London, to lodge and secure the same, under the joint Locks of the Crown, and the Merchant, in any Warehouse or Warehouses, situated at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Company, without Payment, at the Time of the first Entry of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, of the Duties of Customs and Excise due on the Importation thereof, subject nevertheless to the Rules, Regulations and Restrictions, directed by the said Act: Provided always, That no such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize shall be so lodged and secured unless and until such Warehouses and other Works belonging or to belong thereto shall be so far completed, that in the Judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioner of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, the same shall be fit and proper in every respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the same may respectively be safely and securely deposited and remain under the Regulations and Directions of this Act; and the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, are hereby authorized and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known his or their Approbation of such Warehouses; which Certificate shall be published Three Times at the least in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers then usually circulated in London: And whereas by a Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, bearing Date the 16th Day of March 1804, certain Warehouses therein described, belonging to the said West India Dock Company, situated at the Isle of Dogs, were certified to be fit and proper in every respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes as are enumerated and described in the



said Table, annexed to the said Act of Parliament marked (A): And whereas, by the ninth Section of the said Act it is further enacted and provided as follows: That if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient, that the Provisions of this Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, not enumerated or described in either of the Tables to this Act annexed, and shall cause a List of such Goods, Wares and Merchandizes to be published in the London Gazette, then, and from thenceforth, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of this Act shall extend, and be construed to extend to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, in every respect, in as full and ample a Manner, as if the same had been enumerated and inserted in the said Tables respectively, at the Time of passing this Act:

And whereas by a Certificate, under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, bearing Date the 26th Day of March, 1805, the said Lords Commissioners, in pursuance and in execution of the Powers vested in them, in and by the said Act, did thereby declare, that it appeared to them to be expedient that the Provisions of the said Act should be extended to Wines, imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies, (excepted in Table (B), annexed to the said Act,) and that all Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies, whether the same should have been shipped on board such Vessels in the West Indies or elsewhere, might respectively be safely and securely deposited in all or any of the Warehouses described in the above recited Certificate, and remain therein under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act:

And whereas by Three other Certificates under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, bearing Date respectively the 5th Day of July 1805, the 3d Day of November 1806, and the 21st Day of October 1808, certain other Warehouses therein specified belonging to the said Company, situated at the Isle of Dogs aforesaid, were in like Manner certified to be fit and proper in every respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares and Merchandize as are enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said Act of Parliament marked (A), and also for the Reception of Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies, and authorized to be warehoused by the said recited Certificate of the 26th Day of March 1805, issued in pursuance of the 9th Section of the said Act:

And whereas an additional Warehouse hereinafter described, having since been erected by the said Company for the further Accommodation of the West-India Trade; We, the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury do, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, further certify and make known, that the large Warehouse made and erected by the said West India Dock Company, situate on the East End of the Import Dock of the said Company, at the Isle of Dogs aforesaid, is so far completed, that in our Judgment the same is fit and proper in every respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes as are enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said Act of Parliament marked (A); and also for the

Reception of Wines imported in Ships or Vessels arriving from the West Indies, whether the same shall have been shipped on board such Ships or Vessels in the West Indies or elsewhere, in like Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said Table (A), as expressed in the said Certificate of the 26th Day of March 1805, and in which said Warehouse such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, including Wines as aforesaid, may respectively be safely and securely deposited and remain under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act; and we do hereby declare our Approbation of the said Warehouse accordingly.

THE Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy hereby give Notice, that a Plan of Education has been established, at the Royal Naval College at His Majesty's Dock-Yard at Portsmouth, for a Superior Class of Apprentices to Shipwrights.

That the Number of Students in the Superior Class of Shipwrights' Apprentices shall, in the first Instance, be limited to Twelve, but will gradually be increased to Twenty-five. The period of Apprenticeship shall be Seven Years, but for a Student who may have previously served in the Inferior Class of Apprentices in His Majesty's Yards for the Space of Two Years, it shall be only Six Years, and only Five Years for a Student who may have previously served in the said Class for the Space of Three Years.

An Instructor in the Theory of Naval Architecture will be added to the present Establishment of the Royal Naval College, to assist particularly in the Instruction of this Class of Apprentices.

The Candidates for Admission must produce Certificates from two respectable Physicians or Surgeons that they are of sound Health and Constitution, and likewise Proof from the Register of the Parish in which they were born, of their being at least Fifteen, and not more than Seventeen Years of Age, excepting Candidates from among the Shipwrights' Apprentices of the Yard, who may be admitted if they shall not have served more than Three Years of their Time. Candidates shall be examined on the first Wednesday in November in each Year, by the Professor of the Royal Naval College, assisted by the Instructor in the Theory of Naval Architecture, in the Presence of the Commissioner of the Yard, the Lieutenant Governor of the College, and Master Shipwright, who shall jointly report the Result of the Examination to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, carefully inserting the Names of the Candidates in Succession according to their respective Merits.

The following shall be the Subjects of Examination, with which every successful Candidate must be perfectly acquainted.

- 1st. Reading English, and writing it with Facility from Dictation.
- 2d. The first Four Rules of Arithmetic, and the Rule of Three in whole Numbers, and also in Vulgar and Decimal Fractions.

3d. The first Three Books of Euclid's Elements by R. Simson, with the Exception of Propositions 42, 44, 45, Book I. and of Propositions 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, Book II. In this Part of the Examinations, besides giving the most precise Demonstrations, the Candidates will be expected to make the Constructions in a practical Manner with Compasses and a Ruler.

4th. The French Language, a Knowledge of which, although not absolutely required in the Candidates who may present themselves at the first Examination which is to be held, will nevertheless give a Preference to those, who are in all other Respects equally qualified; at all subsequent Examinations, however, the Candidates will be required to read and translate French with Facility.

After Admission into the Superior Class, the Apprentices shall attend at the Royal Naval College Three or Four Hours on the Mornings of every Day in the Week, except Sunday and the established Holidays, where they shall be instructed in such Parts of the following Subjects as shall appear to the Professor of the College to be best adapted to the Object of the Establishment, viz. the Formation of able and useful Ship Builders :

- Geometry Fluxions
- Algebra Theory of Naval
- Plane Trigonometry Architecture.
- Mechanics Drawing
- Hydrostatics The French Language.

On Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays, the Apprentices shall be employed at the College during the Hours above-mentioned, in the Study of Mathematics, under the Professor or the Instructor; on Thursday and Friday Mornings in Drawing, under the Drawing Master, the Art of Perspective being most particularly applied in drawing the different Parts of a Ship; and the Morning of Saturday shall be appropriated to the Study of such Books and Exercises in the French Language, under the French Master, as may perfect them therein, and at the same Time advance their professional Knowledge. This Division of Time allotted for their Studies, is, however, to be subject to such Alterations as shall appear to the Professor best calculated for promoting the Object of the Institution.

In the remaining Part of the Day, when not attending at the College, they shall be employed under the Master Shipwright or Instructor of Naval Architecture, in the Mould Loft, in the various Kinds of manual Labour connected with Ship-building; in the Acquirement of a complete Knowledge of the different Parts of a Ship, and of the Method of constructing and fastening the same, as well as in discriminating her different Properties deducible from theoretical Calculations; also in the Management and Conversion of Timber, and generally, in such other Manner as the Master Shipwright may consider as best adapted to make them fully acquainted with all the Detail of the Duties of a practical Shipwright.

To ensure the Punishment of Offences committed by them during their Attendance at the College, a Book shall be kept by the Instructor, in which such Offences shall be entered; and at the End of each Week, or oftener if there be Occasion, this Book shall be sent to the Office of the Commissioner, who

will order such Punishment to be inflicted, as may be conformable to the usual Treatment of Apprentices in the Dock-Yard.

And at the End of each Year, a Public Examination shall take place, in the Presence of the Officers mentioned in the 3d Article, and a general Statement of the Improvement of the respective Apprentices in the theoretical Part of their Profession, shall be transmitted by the Professor of the College, and of their Progress in the practical Part by the Master Shipwright, through the Commissioner of the Dock-Yard, to the Admiralty-Office; to the End that, if it shall appear that an Apprentice has particularly distinguished himself in any of the Departments of his Profession, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty may confer on him such Mark of their Approbation, as their Lordships may deem expedient.

The last Year of their Apprenticeship, or such Part thereof as the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty may think proper, shall be served at Sea, in such of His Majesty's Ships as their Lordships shall direct, with a view of obtaining some practical Knowledge in the steering, sailing, trimming, and ballasting of a Ship, in making Remarks on the Motion and working of a Ship, in all her Parts, in bad Weather, and on a high Sea, the standing and straining of the Masts and Yards under such Circumstances, the placing of the fixed Blocks, with a view to the proper leading of Ropes, &c. and, generally, in obtaining such Information, as the Captain, Carpenter, and other Officers of the Ship may, by their Experience, communicate, and such as their own Observations may suggest.

During the Time that such an Apprentice shall be on board a Ship, he will be required to keep a Journal of his Remarks and Observations, arranged under distinct Heads, noting such Improvements in any Part of the Ship, or any Thing connected therewith, as may suggest themselves to him, from a minute Attention to the Circumstances by which a Ship is affected at Sea; a Copy of which Journal is to be transmitted to the Admiralty.

A Cabin or Berth will be allotted to him in the Gun-Room, or in some other suitable Part of the Ship; he shall mess with some of the Officers, and be treated in all respects as a Gentleman.
