tenant W. F Carroll, fuccefsfully drew the Attention and Fire of Fort Catilina,) threw, feemingly with confiderable Effect, fome Hundred Shells amongst the Gun-Boats and about the Place of Confiruction, until the Wind coming in from the Weftward, made it neceffary to move them ont.

We have not yet afcertained what has been the Damage or Lofs on the Part of the Enemy, but we have unfortunately on this Occasion to lament the Death of Two highly effeemed and respectable Young Officers, Lieutenant Thomas Worth and Lieutenant John Buckland, of the Royal Marine Artillery, whole Lofs is the Theme of universal Regret. Mr. Samuel Hawkins, Midshipman of the Regret. Norge, alfo fell gallantly, which, with Four Spanish and Four English Seamen wounded, conflitutes our Lofs in killed and wounded, on a Service, the Execution of which merits my warmeft Praife.
