In thick and foggy Weather a Bell will be tolled, by Machinery, Night and Day, at Intervals of Half a Minute.

The Floating Light moored $2\frac{1}{2}$ Miles N. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. from the Bell Rock, will, from the 1st Day of February 1811, be discontinued, and as soon thereafter as the Weather will permit, the Vessel will be removed from her Station.
