minifies, and dilappears. The coloured Light being less powerful may not be feen when the bright Light is first noticed, but the periodical Revolution of the bright Light will be fufficiently diffinguishable.

In thick and foggy Weather a Bell will be tolled, by Machinery, Night and Day, at Intervals of Half a Minute.

The Floating Light moored 21 Miles N. W. 1 N. from the Bell Rock, will, from the til Day of February 1811, be difcontinued, and as foon thereafter as the Weather will permit, the Veffel will be removed from her Station.
