

Tolls and Duties arising, by virtue of an Act of Parliament for that Purpose, out of the Turnpike Road leading from Huntingdon to Somersham; and two Shares of the Tolls and Duties arising, by virtue of another Act of Parliament for that Purpose, out of the Turnpike Roads leading from Bury, in Huntingdon, through Warboys and other Places to the Spread Eagle, in Stratton, being Parts of the Personal Estate of Thomas Evans, late of Knightbridge, in the County of Middlesex, Surgeon, deceased.
