May it please Your Royal Highness,

WE, His Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Merchants, Bankers, Tradesmen, and other principal Inhabitants of the Town and Neighbourhood of Kingston-upon-Hull, beg Leave to present to Your Royal Highness our Sentiments of Condolence on the Malady with which it has pleased the Almighty to afflict our gracious Sovereign, and at the same Time to express our Gratitude for the magnanimous Manner in which Your Royal Highness has consented to supply the Deficiency of the executive Power. Nor can we, in expressing our Obligations to Your Royal Highness, refrain from adverting to the peculiar Circumstances which have given to those Obligations a double Force, and have strengthened every former Claim of Your Royal Highness to our Love and Reverence. When His Majesty was disabled from exercising the Functions of Royalty, we had hoped that the Kingly Office, which we conceive to be a Trust for the Benefit of the People, would, during such Disability, have been fully supplied in Your Royal Person, and that we should not have witnessed, to use your own impressive Language on a former Occasion, "the Sovereign Power of the Realm in a State of Degradation, of curtailed Authority and diminished Energy, a State hurtful in Practice to the Prosperity and good Government of the People, and injurious in its Precedent to the Security of the Monarch and

the Rights of his Family"—That we should not have seen the Completion of "a Project for dividing the Royal Family from each other, for separating the Court from the State, and therefore, by disjoining Government from its natural and accustomed Support, a Scheme for disconnecting the Authority to command Service from the Power of animating it by Reward." Disappointed as we are in these Hopes, we feel ourselves more strongly bound to Your Royal Highness for accepting the Regency under Circumstances which can give no personal Gratification to yourself, and for entering in these perilous Times on an arduous Office, "to which all the invidious Duties of Government are allotted, without the Means of softening them to the Public by the usual Acts of Grace, Favour, or Bénévolence."

Deeply impressed with these Sentiments, and convinced that the Restrictions imposed on Your Royal Highness are not to be justified on any Ground of Right or Expediency, we humbly tender to Your Royal Highness our heartfelt Thanks for the Dignity, Moderation, and Patriotism which you have exhibited on the present Occasion: and to these we would add our firm Conviction, that in your Royal Highness's Hands the Powers of Government, mutilated and curtailed as they are, will be administered for the Benefit of His Majesty's Subjects, and with due Regard to those Principles of Civil and Religious Liberty which secured to us, at the Era of the Revolution, the Blessings of our glorious Constitution; and the Advocates of which Principles have ever proved themselves the firmest Friends of your illustrious Family.
