SIR, March 10, 1811. HAVE the Pleafure to acquaint you, that at Two o'Clock this Moraing, in His Majefty's Ship under my Command, we recaptured a Danish Bark, laden with Timber, bound to Sheernefs.

And at Seven A. M. we captured, after a Chace of an Hour, the French Cutter Privateer Veloci-fere, of Fourteen Guns and Fifty-feven Men, commanded by Jaques Louis Le Due; she is a fine new Veffel, on her first Cruize from Dunkirk, which she left on the 4th Inftant, and had only captured the Danish Bark above-mentioned.
