His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been graciously pleased, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Edward Fogg, of Ardwick Green, near Manchester, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, Merchant, on Behalf of John Barlow, an Infant of the Age of Four Years, His Majesty's Royal Licence and Authority, that the said John Barlow may take and use the Surname of Fogg in lieu of his present Surname of Barlow:

And also to order, that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise to be void and of none Effect.

TREASURY CHAMBERS, WHITEHALL.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for permitting certain Goods, imported into Great Britain, to be secured in Warehouses, without Payment of Duty," it is amongst other things enacted, That it shall and may be

lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Consignee or Consignees, of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes enumerated or described in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (A); and which shall have been legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to lodge and secure the same under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in any Warehouse or Warehouses, situated at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Dock Company, without Payment, at the Time of the first Entry, of the Duties of Customs or Excise, due on the Importation thereof, subject nevertheless to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions directed by the said Act.

Provided always, and it is thereby enacted, that if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of the said Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or described in either of the Tables thereto annexed, and shall cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Act shall extend and be construed to extend to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize in every respect, in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said Tables respectively at the Time of passing this Act.

We the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to and in Execution of the Powers vested in us, in and by the said Act, do hereby declare that it appears to us to be expedient that the Provisions of the said Act should be extended to Cassia Fistula, legally imported or brought into the Port of London, (not being imported by the United Company of Merchants of England, trading to the East Indies,) and that such Cassia Fistula should be added to the List of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said recited Act, marked (A), and that such Cassia Fistula should be lodged and secured under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant in such Warehouse or Warehouses as aforesaid, under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act: And we do further declare, that from and after the Publication of this our Certificate in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the said Act, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Act, shall extend, and be construed to extend to all such Cassia Fistula in every respect, in as full and ample Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in Table (A) annexed to the said Act, at the Time of the passing the same Act.
