**B**y virtue of the Authority in me vested and in conformity with an Ordinance of the 23d May, and an Edict of the 12th August 1800, I do hereby make known, that in compliance with a Petition delivered in, I have permitted and granted that Miltres Anna Darrell, as Executrix, and Messrs. Joseph D. Jones, John P. Jennings, and C. D.
