His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by the Order of His Royal Highnels the Prince Regent in Council of the Eighth Day of February last, prohibiting, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majetty, the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cobles Cordens Master Yards Bowsonies Oars Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eighth Day of August next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be considered for forms Tiese langer. His Part History timed for some Time longer, His Royal Highness in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty; and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the faid Eighth Day of Abgust next, presume to transport into any Parts out Abguit next, prelume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intitled "An 46 Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Expor-" tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to revent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council: But it is nevertheless His

T the Court at Carlton-House, the 19th Day Royal Highnels's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained final extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels of Day Highnels the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

Royal Highnels's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Treighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's National Council. Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vesfel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord Fligh Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majeky's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purpoles of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weil Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, (except as here-inafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Com-missioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commis-sioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Royal Highnels's Pleasure, nevertheless, that the following Articles,
