## PRES'ENT,

His Royal Highnefs the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

W HEREAS the Time limited by the Order of His Royal Highnels the Prince Regent in Council of the Eighth Day of February laft, prohibiting, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majefty, the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Maîts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eighth Day of August next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefly's Service, and the Safety of this King-dom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer; His Royal High-nels, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majefty, and by and with the Advice of His Majefty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the faid Eighth Day of August next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Ca-bles, Cordage, Malts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do fhip or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpen-tine Anchors Cables Cordage Matte Nards Boy. tine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Malts, Yards, Bow-Iprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirtythird Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled " An " Act to enable His Majefty to reftrain the Expor-" tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to " prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and " Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation " or Order in Council:" But it is neverthele(s His Royal Highnefs's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Navy ; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Velfel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Bri-

veral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards or Garrifons, or to H's Majefly's Colonies and Plan-tations in America or the Welt Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factorie's in the East Indies : Provided that upon the Ex-portation of any of the faid Articles for the Pur-poles of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Yards and Garrifons, or to His Majelty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Welt Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coalt of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, (except as hereinafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Com-millioners of His Majelty's Cultoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered outwards, and for the Purpofes fpeio entered outwards, and for the Furpoles pe-cified, and none other; and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners; by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commif-fioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were en-tered outwards: But it is His Royal Highnels's Pleafure, neverthelefs, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Greafe, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majefty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles fo exported are intended for the Use of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the faid Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the faid Articles during the fame Seafon; and provided also that the Exportation of the laid Articles shall, in no Cafe, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the fame Seafon: And the Right Horourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majelty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.
