**N**otice is hereby given, that Application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session, for Leave to bring in a Bill in order to obtain an Act for empowering the Commissioners appointed for putting into Execution the several Acts of Parliament made for improving and com-

pleting the Navigation of the Rivers Thames and Isis, from the Jurisdiction of the City of London, near Staines, in the County of Middlesex, to the Town of Crichlade, in the County of Wilts, to make and complete a navigable Cut or Canal, and to make and erect a Pound Lock therein, with proper Tunnels, Towing Paths, Weirs, Bridges, Channels, Arches, Locks, and other necessary Works from and out of the River Thames at or near a Place called Milson's Point, in the Parish of Egham, in the County of Surrey, opposite to Anchorwick, in the Parish of Wraybury, in the County of Bucks, to join and come into the said River Thames again in the Parish of Egham, in the County of Surrey, near to and below a Place called Bell Weir, nearly opposite to the Boundary Stone of the Jurisdiction of the City of London, near Staines, in the County of Middlesex; and which said Canal is intended to be made in and to pass through the following Parishes and Places, namely, Parish of Egham, in the County of Surrey, and the Parish of Wyardisbury or Wraybury, in the County of Bucks; and also for empowering the said Commissioners to lay the same Tolls at the said intended Pound Lock as at their other Pound Locks, and for enabling them to borrow and raise Money for making and completing the said Canal and other Works; and further for repealing any Clause in any former Act restraining the said Com-
