It will be illuminated by Three Lanterns, hoisted on Three Masts, placed at equal Distances in the Vessel, the Centre one a few Feet higher than the other Two. The Lanterns will be lighted on Saturday the 16th of November next, and will continue to be lit in future from Sun-Set to Sun-Rise.
