A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE P. R.

WHĒREAS it has been represented that a considerable Number of disorderly Persons, chiefly composed of Stockingers, or Persons employed in the Stocking Manufactories, have, for some Time past, assembled themselves together in a riotous and tumultuous Manner in the Town and County of the Town of Nottingham, and likewise in several Parts of the Counties of Nottingham, Derby, and Leicester; and for the Purpose of compelling their Employers to comply with certain Regulations prescribed by themselves with respect to Work, and the Wages to be paid for the same, have had Recourse to Measures of Force and Violence, and have actually committed various Acts of Outrage in different Parts of the Counties above-mentioned, whereby the Property of many of His Majesty's good Subjects has in several Instances been wholly destroyed, and their Lives and Properties are still greatly endangered; We therefore, acting in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty; being duly sensible of the mischievous Consequences which must inevitably ensue, as well to the Peace of the Kingdom as to the Lives and Properties of His Majesty's Subjects, from such wicked and illegal Practices, if they go unpunished, and being firmly resolved to cause the Laws to be put in Execution for the Punishment of such Offenders, have thought fit, by the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to issue this Proclamation, hereby

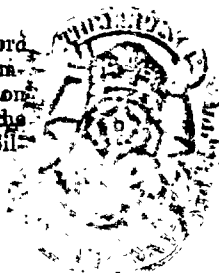
strictly commanding all Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Under Sheriffs, and all other Civil Officers whatsoever, within the said Town and County of the Town of Nottingham, and the said Counties of Nottingham, Derby, and Leicester respectively, that they do use their utmost Endeavours to discover, apprehend, and bring to Justice the Persons concerned in the riotous Proceedings above-mentioned: And, as a further Inducement to discover he said Offenders, We do hereby, acting as aforesaid, promise and declare that any Person or Persons who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, the Authors, Abettors or Perpetrators of any of the Outrages above-mentioned, so that they or any of them may be duly convicted thereof, shall be entitled to the Sum of FIFTY POUNDS for each and every Person who shall be so convicted; and shall also receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon for the said Offence, in case the Person making such Discovery, as aforesaid shall be liable to be prosecuted for the same: And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are hereby required to make Payment accordingly of the said Reward.

Given at the Court at York-House, the Eighteenth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and eleven, in the Fifty-second Year of His Majesty's Reign.

THIS Day the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor, the Alderman, Sheriffs, and Common-Council of the City of London, waited upon His Royal Highness the Prince Regent with the following Address, which was read by John Silvester, Esq; the Recorder:



To His Royal Highness the PRINCE of WALES, REGENT of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland,

The dutiful and loyal Address of the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common-Council assembled.

May it please Your Royal Highness,

WE, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common-Council assembled, humbly approach your Royal Highness on Behalf of ourselves, and the Community at large, with an earnest Request that your Royal Highness will be graciously pleased to adopt such Measures as, with the Advice of the Most Honourable the Privy Council, shall seem meet for causing a Suspension of the Use of Grain in the Distilleries of the United Kingdom, such Suspension appearing to us to be one of the most effectual Means of preventing those serious Evils which a further Rise in the Price of Grain is at this Time so obviously calculated to produce; and we further humbly beg Leave to express our confident Hope, that well aware, as your Royal Highness must be, of the Causes of the present scanty Supply of Grain from foreign Parts, and of the great Distress that may arise therefrom, your Royal Highness, to whose Justice and Humanity we shall not, we trust, appeal in vain, will be graciously pleased to employ all the Means in your Power, by adopting Measures corresponding with your own Royal Character and Disposition, to re-open to us, if it be practicable, those Channels of Intercourse with foreign, and especially neutral Nations, which have heretofore been found so generally advantageous to His Majesty's Subjects, and so good a Security against those dreadful Calamities which are but too often the Consequence of a Scarcity of the Necessaries of Life.

To which Address His Royal Highness was graciously pleased to return the following Answer:

I MUST always see with great concern the Pressure arising from a Deficiency in the Harvest.

I have directed such Steps to be taken as may tend to give the earliest Effect to any Measures which may be adopted by Parliament for the Purpose of relieving the Inconveniencies or Evils likely to result from such Deficiency. And whenever Circumstances shall make it practicable, nothing shall be wanting on my Part to contribute towards the Restoration of Commercial Intercourse between this Country and other Nations to the Footing on which it has been usually conducted, even in the midst of War.

They were all received very graciously, and had the Honour of kissing His Royal Highness's Hand.

VICE-ADMIRAL MURRAY has transmitted to John Wilson Croker, Esq; a Letter which he had received from Lieutenant Southcott, commanding the Princess of Wales Hired Cutter, giving an Account of his having, on the 11th Instant, captured off the Dogger Bank, the Anacreon French Cutter Privateer (formerly the Carrier Cutter), out Twenty-four Days from Groningen, without making any Capture; her Complement was Thirty-seven Men; her Guns thrown overboard during the Chace.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Farquhar, of His Majesty's Ship the *Desirée*, addressed to Admiral Young, and transmitted by him to John Wilson Croker, Esq.

His Majesty's Ship *Desirée*, at Anchor off Schelling, December 12, 1811.

I HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that this Morning, in standing to the Southward to resume my Station after these late Gales, at Half past Eight, a Lugger was discovered to the Eastward of us, making for the Vlie; we immediately gave chase, and at Eleven had gained on her so much as to bring her nearly within Reach of our Guns, but so close to the Island of Schelling, that we were obliged to anchor.

The Boats were then dispatched under the Directions of Lieutenant Ralford, and I have great Satisfaction in saying, that this Service was performed with much Judgment, and the Lugger cap-

tured, Le Brave, of Dunkerque, commanded by Monsieur Messemacker, with a Complement of Sixty Men, and Sixteen Guns, Fourteen only were found on board, Two were thrown overboard in the late Gales, and Thirteen of the Crew made their Escape in a Boat. The Brave is coppered, she sailed from Amsterdam Twenty Days ago, without making any Capture.

His Majesty's Sloop Royalist, in the Downs, Dec. 20, 1811.

I BEG Leave to inform you of the Capture of the French Privateer Le Rodeur, of Fourteen Guns and Sixty Men, by His Majesty's Sloop under my Command, between Dover and Calais, at Eleven o'Clock last Night, after a Chace of Two Hours, nearly all the Time within Musket-Shot.

I regret to say, that we have had One Man killed and Five wounded; the Enemy has had One killed and Eleven wounded:

LEGACY DUTY.

Stamp-Office, London, December 16, 1811.

IT having been deemed expedient to form a new Establishment, under the Commissioners of Stamps, for the better Collection of the Duties on Legacies, and on Residues of personal Estate passing by Wills, and devolving upon Intestacies; Notice is hereby given, that the Office appropriated for that Purpose is the late Hawkers and Pedlars' Office, adjoining the Royal Academy, in Somerset-Place, which will be opened on the First Day of January next; and that the Duties arising under all Wills and Letters of Administration proved in and granted by any Ecclesiastical Court, upon and after the said First Day of January next, are to be assessed and paid at that Office; and that the Duties arising under all Wills and Letters of Administration proved and granted prior to that Day, are to be assessed and paid at the old Office as heretofore.

Printed Forms of Receipts for Legacies, and of Accounts of Residues of personal Estate, with Instructions thereon, may be had at each Office; and on making Application for the same, Executors and Administrators are desired to send their Names and Residence, and the Name of the Testator or Intestate.

They are also desired to observe, that in filling up the Receipts it will be indispensably necessary to specify the Time when the Testator or Intestate died, and the Court where the Will was proved, or Letters of Administration granted; and also to state the Degree of Relationship of the Legatee or next of Kin, according to the Words of the Act of Parliament, which are printed for the Guidance of Executors and Administrators on the Back of the Receipts.

The Duties are to be paid within Twenty-one Days after the Date of the Receipts for Legacies and Residues, and the Receipts are to be dated on the Day of signing the same. Executors and Administrators paying Legacies and Residues without taking proper Receipts, and paying the Duties within the Time prescribed, and Legatees and next of Kin receiving Legacies and Residues without giving proper Receipts for the same, and allowing a Deduction of the Duties, will be respectively liable to Penalties of Ten per Cent. on the Amount of such Legacies or Residues.

And as the Commissioners will be furnished by the Ecclesiastical Courts with Copies of all Wills, and an Account of all Letters of Administration, they will know on whom to call for Payment of the



Duties; and they will enforce the Payment thereof by Suit in the Court of Exchequer, if not paid in due Time.

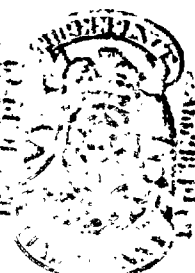
