

jeſty, the Captain ſhall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but ſhall alſo forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Maſteſty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly ſuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or ſign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the ſaid Tools, or knowingly ſuffer the ſame to be done, he ſhall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforeſaid, and alſo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Maſteſty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures ſhall be applied to the Uſe of His Maſteſty, and the other Moiety to the Uſe of the Perſon who ſhall ſue for the ſame.

BY theſe Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above-mentioned are extended to Perſons packing or putting on board any Veſſel, not bound directly for ſome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Preſs, Paper, Utensil, or Implement whatſoever, uſed in or proper for the working or finiſhing of the Cotton, Steel, or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of ſuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Perſons receiving or being in Poſſeſſion of any ſuch Articles, with an Intent to export the ſame to Foreign Parts, and all Custom-houſe Officers ſuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are reſpectively liable to the like Penalties as are above-mentioned, in the caſe of Tools and Utensils uſed in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
