## Monday, June 1, 1812.

HIS Day being appointed for the Installation of the Knights Elect of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, His Royal Highness the Duke of York, as Great Master; the Reverend Doctor William Vincent, Dean of Westminster, Dean of the Order; several of the Knights Com-panions, dressed in the full habit of the Order; the Knights Elect in their surcoats, mantles, and spurs; and the Proxies of the absent Knights Elect in surcoats, bearing the mantles of their respective Principals on their right arms, met in the Princes Chamber, Westminster; where the Officers of the order, in their surcoats, mantles, chains, and badges; the Officers of arms, in their tabards; the Sub-Dean and Prebendaries of Westminster, in their mantles of the order; several Esquires of the Knights Companions, and the Esquires of the Knights Elect, also attended, and went in proces-sion to the south east door of Westminster Abbey; from thence, passing down the south side aisle, and turning through the last arch next the great west door, crossed the middle aisle, and proceeded up the north side aisle, and, by the great transept of the abbey, into King Henry the Seventh's chapel, in the following order:

Six men in crimson silk scarves, with long staves, to clear the way, uncovered.

Drums of His Majesty's household.

The drum-major.

Kettle drums and trumpets.

Serjeant trumpeter, with his mace.

- Twelve alms' men of the church of Westminster, two and two, in their gowns, with the badges of the order.
- The Messenger of the order, in his surcoat, chain, and badge, his cap in his hand.
- The Esquires of the Knights elect, three and three, in their surcoats, their caps in their hands.
- Esquires of the Knights companions, in their surcoats, their caps on their heads.

Prebendaries of the church of Westminster, two and two.

The Sub-Dean of Westminster, carrying the bible in his right hand.

Officers of arms, according to their rank, in their tabards; viz.

Pursuivants.

Heralds.

Norroy king of arms.

KNIGHTS ELECT and PROXIES.

The Knights elect carrying their hats and feathers in their hands; the Proxies wearing the surcoat, and girt with the sword of the order, having no spurs, or the hat and feathers, but each walking with a hat in his hand, and bearing the mantle of his Principal upon his right arm; viz.
