AT the Court at *Carlton House*, the 11th of June 1812,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

HIS Royal Highness in Council was this day pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to declare Dudley Earl of Harrowby, Lord President of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and his Lordship took his place at the Board accordingly.

His Royal Highness having been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to appoint the Right Honourable Henry Earl Bathurst, and the Right Honourable Henry Viscount Sidmouth, to be two of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, their Lordships were this day, by His Royal Highness's command, sworn two of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.

Westminster, June 9, 1812.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, for declaring His Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for settling and securing certain annuities on the widow and eldest son of the late Right Ho-

nourable Spencer Perceval; and for granting a sum of money for the use of his other children.

An Act to grant an excise duty on spirits made or distilled from sugar in Ireland, during the prohibition of distillation from corn or grain there, in lieu of the excise duty now chargeable thereon; and to allow a drawback on the export thereof.

An Act to allow the use of sugar in brewing beer in Great Britain.

An Act to explain and amend an Act of the Fiftieth year of His present Majesty, to regulate the taking of securities in all offices in respect of which security ought to be given, and for avoiding the grant of all such offices, in the event of such security not being given within a time to be limited after the grant of such offices.

An Act to enable coadjutors to Archbishops and Bishops in Ireland, to execute the powers of Archbishops and Bishops respectively.

An Act for more effectually preventing the embezzlement of securities for money and other effects left or deposited for safe custody or other special purpose, in the hands of Bankers, Merchants, Brokers, Attornies, or other Agents.

An Act for extending the provisions of an Act of the Thirtieth year of King George the Second, against persons obtaining money by false pretences, to persons so obtaining bonds and other securities.

An Act for inclosing the Forest of Delamere, in the county of Chester.

An Act to explain, amend, and enlarge the powers of certain Acts passed for making and maintaining the Grand Junction Canal.

An Act for making and maintaining a navigable canal with aqueducts, feeders, and reservoirs, from the Stort Navigation, at or near Bishop's Stortford, in the county of Hertford, to join the River Cam, near Clayhithe Sluice, in the county of Cambridge, with a navigable branch or cut from the said canal at Sawston, to Whaddon, in the county of Cambridge.

An Act for making and maintaining a railway from Penrhyn Mawr, in the parish of Llanfangel Esceifiog to Redwharf, in the parish of Llanbedr-goch, in the county of Anglesey, and also a dock in the parish of Llanbedr-goch.

An Act for draining, inclosing, and improving the lands called Borough Fen Common, and the



Four hundred Acre Common, in the county of Northampton, and for forming the same into a parish, to be called Newborough; and for building and endowing a church for such parish.

An Act for forming into townships certain extra-parochial lands in Wildmore Fen, and in the West and East Fens, in the county of Lincoln.

An Act for embanking the Hundred Feet Washes in the Great Level of the Fens called Bedford Level.

An Act for enabling the Highgate Archway Company to raise a further sum of money to complete their works.

An Act for altering and enlarging the powers of an Act of His present Majesty, for erecting a bridge across the River Thames, near Vauxhall, and making roads thereto, in the counties of Middlesex and Surrey.

An Act for establishing a ferry over the River Thames, from Greenwich, in the county of Kent, to the Isle of Dogs, in the county of Middlesex; and for making and maintaining roads to communicate therewith.

An Act for widening and improving the street or road leading from Tower Hill to the street called Upper East Smithfield, in the parish of Saint Botolph without Aldgate, in the county of Middlesex.

An Act for enlarging the term and powers of an Act of King George the First, two Acts of King George the Second, and an Act of His present Majesty, for repairing the roads from Gloucester towards Hereford, and other roads therein mentioned, all in the county of Gloucester.

An Act for more effectually repairing the road from the Old Furnace to Newbridge, and Merthyr Tydvil, in the county of Glamorgan, and from Merthyr Tydvil to the bridge over the River Taff which divides the counties of Glamorgan and Brecon.

An Act for continuing the term and for altering and amending several Acts passed in the Third, Twenty-fourth, and Forty-third years of His present Majesty, for repairing, amending, and keeping in repair several roads within the county of Carmarthen.

An Act for making a new branch of road from the town of Carmarthen to Lougher, in the county of Glamorgan, and another branch of road from the Great Mountain to Llandilo, in the same county.

An Act for altering and enlarging the powers of two Acts passed in the Parliament of Ireland in the Thirtieth and Thirty-second years of His present Majesty, and of an Act passed in the Forty-fifth year of His present Majesty, for repairing several roads in the counties of Carlow, Kilkenny, and Tipperary; and also for more effectually repairing and maintaining the road leading from the town of Clonmel through the county of Waterford to the cross roads of Knocklofty, in the county of Tipperary.

An Act for maintaining the road leading from the city of Cork to the town of Tralee, in the county of Kerry.

An Act for making a public carriage-road from the present turnpike road near the south end of Highbury-Place, Islington, to Haberdashers'-Walk, in the parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, in the county of Middlesex.

An Act to continue the term and alter and en-

large the powers of two Acts of the Eleventh and Thirty-second years of His present Majesty, for repairing the road from the Market House in the town of Great Faringdon, in the county of Berks, to Burford, in the county of Oxford.

Emulous of the example shewn us by our ancestors, of inviolable attachment to our princes, we rejoice in every prosperous, and lament every unfortunate event that befalls them; and we crave permission most sincerely to condole with your Royal Highness on the loss of a Minister so every way fitted to second and to carry into execution your beneficent purposes for the welfare and prosperity of the British empire.

We are duly sensible of the blessings we enjoy under the mild and auspicious government of your royal house; and that it may be continued to us from generation to generation, is the object of our most ardent wishes and prayers.

Looking back with the most unqualified sentiments of approbation on the high and important services of Mr. Perceval, we beg to offer the humble but sincere tribute of our applause to the wisdom and firmness manifested by your Royal Highness, in calling that lamented statesman to your councils, thus consulting at once your own dignity, and the highest interests of the empire. To the steady and inflexible virtue, the generous disinterestedness, the ardent patriotism, and the sound and liberal policy of that illustrious man, we can offer no higher applause than the expression of our most anxious hope, that the same enlightened views may guide the conduct of his successors; and that in his fall we may not have to lament the fall of those principles of domestic and foreign policy, which directed the bright career of his administration.

In this season of general alarm and mourning, we beg permission to assure your Royal Highness of the steady loyalty and warm attachment which we bear to our revered Monarch and to your royal house and person; and our resolution, under every circumstance of danger or privation, to support the crown and dignity of the realm; well assured that such conduct, on the part of every subject, can alone preserve to us that high and favoured place which it is our envied lot to hold among surrounding nations.

The humble and dutiful Address of the Provost, Magistrates, and Common Council of the ancient Royal Borough of Inverness.

May it please your Royal Highness,

WE, His Majesty's loyal and dutiful subjects, the Provost, Magistrates, and Common Council of the ancient Royal Borough of Inverness, do humbly beg leave to approach your Royal Highness, to express the horror, grief, and indignation we felt at the atrocious and unexampled murder of the Right Honourable Spencer Perceval, Chancellor of the Exchequer, within the walls of the House of Commons, on his way to discharge his important public duties.

When we reflect on the immense loss your Royal Highness and the country have sustained in the death of this most able and virtuous Minister, we

would feel it a great national calamity, had it occurred in the ordinary course of human life; but the reflection that the existence of such a man has been terminated by the hand of a base and wicked assassin, while in the ardent prosecution of measures which seemed so well calculated to raise the British empire to the highest pitch of glory, and of affording to the Continent of Europe a prospect of recovering its independence, our hearts are pierced with the deepest sorrow. In the gloom and consternation which this horrid act occasions, we derive some consolation in the assurance that its vile author had no associate.

Your Royal Highness will, we humbly request, permit us to make tender of our warmest gratitude for your most gracious message to both Houses of Parliament—the numerous and afflicted family of so valuable and so lamented a Minister, are well entitled to receive a liberal provision from their sympathising country.

We beg leave to reiterate our high admiration of those principles which actuated our beloved and venerable Sovereign's government, and which have been so successfully pursued by your Royal Highness—persuaded, as we are, that they are the best calculated for securing the independence of these realms, and of maintaining their high and distinguished rank in the scale of nations.

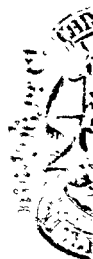

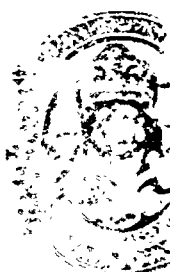
