CAPTAIN STEWART, commanding His Majesty's ship the Dictator, has transmitted to John Wilson Croker, Esq. a letter from Lieutenant Duell, of that ship, giving an account of his having, in one of her boats, on the 6th instant, captured, after a short resistance, His Danish Majesty's lugger No. 28, commanded by a lieutenant, and manned with twelve men. No loss was sustained on our side; the enemy had two men killed and three wounded.

Whitehall, October 31, 1812.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent hath been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Morton John Eden, of Beamish, in the parish of Chester-le-Street, in the county palatine of Durham, Esq. second son of Sir John Eden, late of Windlestone and West Auckland, in the said county palatine, Bart. deceased, and grandson of Sir Robert Eden, late of Windlestone and West Auckland aforesaid, Bart. by dame Mary his wife, who was the sister and coheir of Morton Davison, late of Beamish aforesaid, Esq. all deceased, His Majesty's royal licence and authority, that he may, in compliance with an injunction contained in the last will and testament of the said Morton Davison, Esq. deceased, take and use the surname of Davison only; and that he may also bear the arms of Davison quarterly with those of Eden; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise His Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to order, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
