

Two thirds of the oak timber to be of 70 feet stick and upwards, and the remaining third to be of 60 feet stick and upwards; of the elm timber, no tree to be under 80 feet; and the ash timber to be from 20 to 60 feet, and the elm stocks to be chopped and bored.

No tenders for less quantities than 100 loads of timber, and 5000 of the fellies and spokes, will be considered; and further particulars, together with the terms and conditions of the contract, may be known at the Secretary's Office, in Pall-Mall aforesaid, any day between the hours of ten and four o'clock; where the proposals must be delivered, sealed up, and indorsed "Proposals for Timber;" but no proposal can be admitted after the said 18th day of November, at twelve o'clock at noon of the same day; neither will any tender be noticed, unless the party making it, or an agent in his behalf, shall attend.
