## A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, P. R.

WHEREAS We are informed that great numbers of mariners and seafaring men, His Majesty's natural-born subjects, are in the service of divers foreign princes and states, to the prejudice of His Majesty's kingdom; and whereas attempts may be made to seduce some of His Majesty's subjects, contrary to their allegiance and duty to His Majesty, to enter on board ships or vessels of war, or other ships or vessels belonging to the United States of America, with intent to commit hostilities against His Majesty or His subjects, or otherwise to adhere or give aid or comfort to His Majesty's enemies upon the sea; now We, in order that none of His Majesty's subjects may ignorantly incur the guilt and penalties of such breaches of their allegiance and duty, have thought it necessary, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to publish this Proclamation, hereby notifying and declaring that all persons, being His Majesty's subjects, who shall enter or serve or be found on board any ships or vessels of war, or other ships or

vessels belonging to the United States of America, with intent to commit hostilities against His Majesty or His subjects, or who shall otherwise adhere or give aid or comfort to His Majesty's enemies upon the sea, will thereby become liable to suffer the pains of death, and all other pains and penalties of high treason and piracy; and We do hereby declare, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, Our intention and firm resolution to proceed against all such offenders according to law.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the twenty-sixth day of October one thousand eight hundred and twelve, and in the fifty-third year of His Majesty's reign.

GOD save the KING.

AT the Court at Carlton-House, the 26th day of October 1812,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council, bearing date the eighth day of November last, for the payment of the bounties for the encouragement of seamen and landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and the rewards for discovering seamen who may conceal themselves, so that such seamen should be taken for His Majesty's service, and also the rewards to persons who should procure the voluntary service of able and ordinary seamen and landmen fit for His Majesty's Naval Service, and should convey such seamen and landmen on board any of His Majesty's ships and vessels, or to any of His Majesty's sea officers employed in raising men, will expire on the thirty-first day of December next, which bounties and rewards are as follows; that is to say, To every able seaman, not above the age of fifty nor under the age of twenty years, who should enter himself to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, a bounty of five pounds; and to every ordinary seaman so entering himself, and not above the age of fifty nor under the age of twenty years, a bounty of two pounds ten shillings; to every able-bodied landman, not above the age of thirty-five nor under the age of eighteen years, so entering himself, a bounty of thirty shillings; to every person or persons who shall discover any able or ordinary seaman or seamen who may have concealed him or themselves, so that such seaman or seamen shall be taken for His Majesty's service by any of His Majesty's officers employed to raise men, a reward of three pounds for every such able seaman, and fifty shillings for every such ordinary seaman fit to serve on board His Majesty's ships; to any person or persons who shall procure the voluntary service of able or ordinary seamen or landmen fit for His Majesty's service, and shall convey them on board any of His Majesty's ships or vessels, or to any of His Majesty's sea officers employed in raising men, a reward of three guineas for every such able seaman, and two guineas
