

Pursuant to an Order of the High Court of Chancery, bearing date the 30th day of May 1812, made in a Cause Cotterell against Cotterell, any person or persons claiming to be Next of Kin of Charles Cotterell, late of Layton, in the County of Essex, Gentleman, deceased, (who died on or about the 27th day of January 1807,) are to come in before Francis Paul Stratford, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, and prove such Kindred, on or before the 19th day of December next, or in default thereof they will be peremptorily excluded the benefit of the said Order.
