BY virtue of the authority in me vested, and in conformity with an ordinance of 23d May, and an edict of the 12th August 1800, I do hereby make known, that, in compliance with a petition delivered in, I have permitted and granted, that the Executive to the late Honourable Chamberlain Robert Tuite, Charles Mac Carthy, Esquire, may summon by proclama sub pena præclusi et perpetui silentii, all the known or unknown Creditors to the said Honourable Chamberlain Robert Tuite, deceased, residing in European or American territories, to come forward with their demands, and to enter and prove their claims, in person or by their attorneys, before the said Executive, previous to the expiration of the period herein-after limited; that is to say, within one year and six weeks from the period when this proclama shall have been recorded in the Upper Courts of the islands of St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. John, and published three times consecutively in the London Gazette; and all such known or unknown Creditors as reside in any of the West India islands or colonies, shall come forward with their demands, and enter and prove their claims, in person or by their attorneys, before the Executive, within three months from the date of this proclama being recorded in the Superior and Inferior Courts of the islands of St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. John,
