WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that, some time between the afternoon of Monday the 28th and Wednesday the 30th of December last, some person or persons did feloniously enter the dwelling-house and premises of William Webb, situate at Roddenbury-Hill, in the parish of Warminster, in the county of Wilts, yeoman (close to the borders of Longleat-Park), and did commit a most horrid and barbarous murder upon the bodies of the said William Webb, and of Mary Gibbons his maid servant, by the use of a gun, loaded with shot and nails, and of some heavy keen cutting instrument; and whereas it hath been further represented, that there is just reason to believe, that the said dwelling-house was then plundered of many valuable articles, particularly one silver cream-jug, one silver snuff-box, two silver

table-spoons, five silver tea-spoons, and a considerable quantity of gold and silver coin;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the said murders, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person or persons who actually perpetrated the same) who shall discover his or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. And, as a further encouragement, a reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered to any person making such discovery as aforesaid (except as is before excepted), to be paid on the conviction of any one or more of the offenders.
