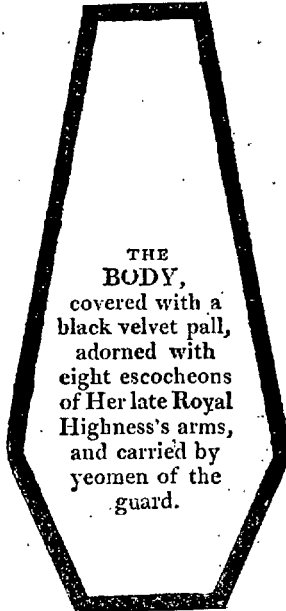

The procession moved down the South aisle and up the middle aisle into the Choir; where the body was placed on a platform immediately over the opening to the Royal Vault, and the coronet and cushion were laid on the coffin. The Chief Mourner sat at the head of the corpse; his supporters on either side; and the supporters of the pall in their places near the body.

The part of the service before the interment being read, the corpse was deposited in the Royal Vault; and the Honourable and Reverend the Dean of Windsor having concluded the burial service, Garter proclaimed Her late Royal Highness's style, as follows:

Thus it hath pleased Almighty God to take out of this transitory life unto His Divine Mercy, the late Most Illustrious Princess AUGUSTA Duchess of BRUNSWICK, Widow of His Most Serene Highness CHARLES WILLIAM FERDINAND DUKE of BRUNSWICK, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, and sister of His Most Excellent Majesty GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith; whom God bless and preserve with long life, health, and honour, and all wordly happiness.
